HEREAS by an A&, paffed in the Fortythird Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled " An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain, to be fecured in Warehoules without Payment of Duty," it was enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees of any Goods, Wares, or Merchaudize enumerated or deferibed in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (C), which shall be legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to land any fuch Goods, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, of the Duties of Cultom due on the Importation thereof; and fuch Goods may be lodged and fecured at or in fuch Places, and under fuch Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions as the Commissioners of the Cuttoms in England, or any Four or more of them, shall approve and direct, upon the faid Importer, Proprietor, or Confignee entering into Bond to His Majelly, his Heirs, and Succeffors, with One fufficient Surety, to be approved of by the Collector and Comptroller of the Cuftoms of the faid Fort of London, in double the
