*Copy of a Letter from Captain Henry Boys, Commander of His Majesty's Sloop the Mofelle, addressed to Vice-Admiral Rowley, Commander in Chief in Jamaica, and transmitted by the Admiral to the Honourable W. Wellesley Poie.*

SIR, *Mofelle at Sea, May 28, 1809.*

I BEG leave to acquaint you, that I have this Day, after a few Hours Chace, captured the French National Schooner Le Beau Narcisse, of Eight Guns and Fifty-five Men, commanded by Monsieur Louis Ores, Enseigne de Vaisseau; she left St. Domingo on a Cruize on the 7th of May.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain, to be secured in Warehouses without Payment of Duty," it was enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Consignee or Consignees of any Goods, Wares, or Merchandize enumerated or described in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (C), which shall be legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to land any such Goods, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, of the Duties of Custom due on the Importation thereof; and such Goods may be lodged and secured at or in such Places, and under such Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as the Commissioners of the Customs in England, or any Four or more of them, shall approve and direct, upon the said Importer, Proprietor, or Consignee entering into Bond to His Majesty, his Heirs, and Successors, with One sufficient Surety, to be approved of by the Collector and Comptroller of the Customs of the said Port of London, in double the
