as aforefaid, and exported directly from thence, or that the full Duties due and payable on the Importation of such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall be paid to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cultoms, within the Space of Twelve Months from the Date of the first Entry of such Goods; and it was further enacted, that if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treatury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of the faid Act should be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables annexed thereto, and should cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Re-flrictions of the faid Act shall extend to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inferted and enumerated in the faid Tables respectively, at the Time of passing the said Act:
