South West, including Portsmouth, Isle of Wight, and Christchurch,

Western,

Woolwich, with its Dependencies, Warley, and Chatham,

for a Period of Six Months, from the 1st of October next.

The Forage to be furnished in Rations, consisting as hereafter may from Time to Time be required, either of

10 lbs. of Oats,

12 lbs. of Hay, and

8 lbs. of Straw,

or of 7 lbs. of Oats,

14 lbs. of Hay, and

8 lbs. of Straw,

and must be delivered at the respective Stations at the Expence of the Contractor, who is also to furnish such Horses with Oats, at 8lbs. per Ration, as may be billeted within the District for which he contracts.

The Proposals may be delivered separately or jointly for Two or more of the said Districts; and it is expected that the Contractor shall receive the Stable Dung that during the Period of his Contract may accumulate, making an Allowance for the same, after the Rate of per Horse per Week.
