Whereas some Time in the Month of September 1808, Mr. John Wrangle, who formerly resided in or about Hackney, in the County of Middlesex, being on his Travels about the North of England, proceeded to a certain Place in Scotland called Ardincaple, in the Parish of Row, and County of Dumbarton, in Front of the River Clyde, and on the North Side thereof, and continued several Days at an Inn, called Ardincaple Inn; and about the 23d of September, whilst he was at the Inn, he obtained a small Boat belonging to the Landlord for the Purpose of rowing to a small Place or Village on the Coast, and was seen that Evening betwixt the Hill of Ardmore and Roseneath Point, but never afterwards returned, and the Boat was found upset the next Day in a Lock near a certain Place on the Coast, called Row-Point.—From this Occurrence, and from the necessary Enquiries made immediately afterwards, without Effect, it was generally apprehended and believed, that the missing Person had slipped from the Boat, whilst rowing or sculling, and was drowned; but as the Body could never afterwards be found, although a Reward was publicly announced to any Person or Persons who should find it, this further public Inquiry is now made; and Notice is accordingly hereby given, that if any Person or Persons can ascertain the finding of the Body of the said John Wrangle, or its Interment, such Person or Persons, upon such Fact being properly authenticated before
