THIS Day the Right Reverend Father in God, John Lord Bishop of London, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

AT the Council-Chamber at the *Queen's Palace*, the 27th of September 1809,

P R E S E N T,

The Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

IT is this Day ordered by their Lordships, that His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, do prepare the Form of a Prayer and Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the Protection afforded the King's Majesty during a long and an arduous Reign; such Prayer to be used in the Service appointed for the Day, after the General Thanksgiving, in all Churches and Chapels in England, and Wales, and Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, on Wednesday the Twenty-fifth of October next, being the Day on which His Majesty began His happy Reign.

And it is hereby further ordered, that His Majesty's Printer do forthwith print a competent Number of Copies of the said Form of Prayer and Thanksgiving, that the same may be forthwith sent round and read in the several Churches of England and Wales, and the Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed.
