WHEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty, in Council, that in His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, appointing the Places for the Performance of Quarantine by Ships and Vessels bound to the several Ports of this Kingdom, Highlake, near Liverpool, is prescribed as the Place for the Performance of Quarantine by Vessels arriving at the Port of Liverpool, liable thereto; but that Bromborough Pool has been found, on a careful Inquiry recently made, to be a safer and more convenient Place for the Performance thereof; His Majesty is therefore pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby

ordered, that all such Ships or Vessels as are or shall be bound to the Port of Liverpool, or any Creek or Place belonging to or within the said Port, from any Place or Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed, shall in future perform their Quarantine in Bromborough Pool, instead of Highlake: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for further continuing, until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships," it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign Ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irish Ships;" which, by an Act made in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, was revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six, and extended to Goat-Skins imported in Foreign Ships; and which was further continued by an Act made in the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight, shall be, and the same is thereby further continued until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace: And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the Fif-

teenth Day of March last, pursuant to the Powers vested in His Majesty by the said Act, to allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Twenty-fifth Day of the said Month of March, the Importation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat-Skins, dressed or undressed, on the Terms specified in the said Order: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Permission should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant September, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat-Skins, dressed or undressed, in any Foreign Ship or Vessel; and His Majesty doth hereby order, that, on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel, with any of the Articles above mentioned, the said Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

THE following Address having been transmitted to the Earl of Liverpool, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been, by his Lordship, presented to the King; which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Provincial Synod of Aberdeen, met at Aberdeen, this 11th Day of October 1809, participating in that Joy, which universally prevails in your Dominions, on the approaching Anniversary of your Accession to the Throne, beg Leave, with all Humility and Respect, to express to your Majesty, the Sense, which we entertain of the Divine Goodness, in having blessed these Realms with your Majesty's mild and equitable Government for near Half a Century.

Whether we contrast the Instability of other Thrones, with the firm Basis on which that of your Majesty is placed; whether we look Abroad to the Misery of the surrounding Nations, or at Home to the Happiness of our own; whether we contemplate the Comforts enjoyed by all Classes of your Majesty's Subjects in this favoured Land, or reflect on the Encouragement afforded to Religion in general, by your Majesty's Example and Influence, and the Support experienced by our own Ecclesiastical Establishment in particular; our Hearts are filled with the most lively Sentiments of Gratitude and Attachment: and we beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that we will continue to maintain and advance the Interests of Religion, and to inculcate on the People committed to our Care, that Righteousness which exalts a Nation, and to guard them against that Sin, which is the Reproach, and must be the Ruin of any People.

That your Majesty may long sway the Sceptre of this Kingdom; that under the Weight of declining Years, you may be solaced by the Love and Veneration of your Subjects, and the Duty and Affection of your Family; and that when you shall be called upon to resign your earthly Crown, a heavenly Crown may be the Reward of your Piety, and many other exalted Virtues, is the Prayer of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's loyal and dutiful Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Provincial Synod of Aberdeen, and subscribed in our Name and Presence, and by our Appointment by
