WHEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty, in Council, that in His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, appointing the Places for the Performance of Quarantine by Ships and Vessels bound to the several Ports of this Kingdom, Highlake, near Liverpool, is prescribed as the Place for the Performance of Quarantine by Vessels arriving at the Port of Liverpool, liable thereto; but that Bromborough Pool has been found, on a careful Inquiry recently made, to be a safer and more convenient Place for the Performance thereof; His Majesty is therefore pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby

ordered, that all such Ships or Vessels as are or shall be bound to the Port of Liverpool, or any Creek or Place belonging to or within the said Port, from any Place or Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed, shall in future perform their Quarantine in Bromborough Pool, instead of Highlake: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for further continuing, until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships," it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign Ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irish Ships;" which, by an Act made in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, was revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six, and extended to Goat-Skins imported in Foreign Ships; and which was further continued by an Act made in the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight, shall be, and the same is hereby further continued until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace: And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the Fif-
