CONTRACT for supplying FRESH BEEF to the TROOPS in WALCHEREN.

Commissary in Chief's Office,

Notice is hereby given to such Persons as may be willing to contract to supply His Majesty's Troops in the Island of Walcheren with Fresh Beef, that Tenders to that Effect will be received at this Office until Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon on the 1st of November.

Particulars as follow, viz.

One Thousand Oxen to be delivered at Walcheren. The first Delivery, of One Hundred and Fifty Oxen, to be made on the 14th November; and each subsequent Delivery, at the Period required by the Commissary-General on the Spot.

The Ofsal to be at the Disposal of the Contractor.

If deemed unfit for the Troops, the Rejection to be admitted on the Certificate of the Officer commanding the Regiment, Troop, or Detachment, the Quarter-Master, or Person acting in that Capacity, and the Commissary.

The Contractor to have an Agent upon the Spot, who must furnish the Supplies on the Requisitions of the Commissary.

Two Weeks Supply to be kept upon the Spot.

Persons tendering will specify the Price at which they will deliver the Beef per Pound to the Commissary at Walcheren, free of every Expence of Conveyance; as also the Price per Pound if the Conveyance is provided by Government; in which latter Case, the Shipments must be confined to the Ports between Leith and the Thames inclusive.

Payment will be made at this Office, by Cheques upon the Bank of England, on the Production by the Contractor of the Receipt of Delivery, signed by the senior Officer of the Commissariat Department at Walcheren, and approved by the Officer commanding the Troops; the Form of which Receipt will be given at this Office.

N. B. Sufficient Security will be required for the due Performance of this Contract.
