### PROCLAMATION

· For pardoning Deferters from His Majefly's Land Forces.

War-Office, October 24, 1809. W HEREAS it has been moft humbly fubmitted to the King, whether, on the joyful Occasion of His Majefty's entering into the Fiftieth Year of His Reign, it might no be defirable to diffinguish fo memorable an Epoch by an Act of Grace to all Deferters ; and His Majefty having gracioufly ap-proved of His Free Pardon being extended to all fuch Deferters from His Land Forces as shall deliver themfelves up within Two Months from the 25th Instant : Thefe are publicly to declare His Ma-jefly's benevolent Intention ; and to direct that all Deforters, furrendering themfelves to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, or to any of the Superintending Field Officer: of the Recruiting Service, whofe Stations are mentioned in the Nargin hereof; to the Commandant Durbam. of the Army Depôt in the Ifle of Wight; or, where there is no Military Poll, to a Magistrate, shall be pardoned, and they Carlifle. Leeds. are bereby pardoned accordingly.

Manchester. Nottingham. Ipfwich. Ŝbrewfbury. Birmingham. Hereford. Bedford. Maidftone. Gioucefter. Southampton.

Such Deferters, if from the Regular Forces, being Able-bodied Men and fit for Service, shall be fent to the Regiments from which they refpectively deferted, or be appointed to fuch Regiments in the United Kingdom as His Majesty may be pleased to command; and, when so placed, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other

Corps to which they may formerly have belonged: and if from the Mi-Wells. Lendon. litia, shall be fent to the Regiments to which they respectively belonged.

And Whereas many of the faid Deferters may have enlifted in other Corps, and are now ferving therein, His Majeffy is gracicully pleaked to extend to fuch Deferters the Benefit of this Pardon ; and to direct that they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, upon declaring themfelves to their respective Commanding Officers, on or before the Period abovementioned : and they shall not be liable, at any future Time. to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly ferved.

The Magistrate, to whom any Deferter, as above, may furrender himfelf, is authorized and required to certify the Day on which fuch Deferter furrendered himfelf; which Certificate is to continue in Force until the Arrival of the Deferter at the nearest Military Post, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unless prevented by Sickness, to be certified by fome Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magistrate's Certificate; or to be otherwife proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer command. ing at fuch Military Post.

His Majefty has further been pleafed to direct, that Deferters now actually in Confinement as such, shall have the Benefit of this His Royal Pardon.
