Southampton. not be liable to be claimed by any other
Wells. Corps to which they may formerly
London. have belonged: and if from the Mi-
 litia, shall be sent to the Regiments to which they
 respectively belonged.

And Whereas many of the said Deserters may have
 enlisted in other Corps, and are now serving therein,
 His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to such
 Deserters the Benefit of this Pardon; and to direct
 that they shall continue to serve in the Corps wherein
 they now are, upon declaring themselves to their re-
 spective Commanding Officers, on or before the Pe-
 riod abovementioned: and they shall not be liable, at
 any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in
 which they formerly served.

The Magistrate, to whom any Deserter, as above,
 may surrender himself, is authorized and required to
 certify the Day on which such Deserter surrendered
 himself; which Certificate is to continue in Force
 until the Arrival of the Deserter at the nearest Mil-
 itary Post, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten
 Miles a Day, unless prevented by Sickness, to be cer-
 tified by some Medical Practitioner on the Back of
 the Magistrate's Certificate; or to be otherwise
 proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer command-
 ing at such Military Post.

His Majesty has further been pleased to direct,
 that Deserters now actually in Confinement as such,
 shall have the Benefit of this His Royal Pardon.
