Copy of a Letter from Captain Macdonald, of the Red Pole Sloop, dated the 10th Instant, addressed to Vice-Admiral Campbell, and transmitted by the latter to John Wilson Croker, Esq.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that on the 9th Instant, at Daylight, Beachy Head N. by E. Nine Leagues, Wind W. Two Luggers were observed on our Lee Bow, to which chase was immediately given; and at Ten, I had the good Fortune to get alongside the weathermost, which had the Temerity to engage us for Half an Hour, when she surrendered. She proves to be Le Grand Rodeur, of Boulogne, Sixteen Guns and Eighty Men, Captain J. G. Huret, Four Days from Dieppe, and had made no Capture. I am sorry to add, that the Privateer had One Man killed and Two wounded, One of them badly. Towards the latter

Part of the Chace, His Majesty's Sloop Pelican  
hove in Sight, and pursued the other, but did not  
capture her. To the Officers and Ship's Company  
I feel greatly indebted for their cool and steady  
Conduct during the Chace and Action, when every  
Manœuvre was attempted by the Enemy to escape.
