THE Marquis Welllesley, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has this Day notified to the Ministers of Friendly and Neutral Powers resident at this Court, that His Majesty has judged it expedient to direct that the necessary Measures should be taken for the Blockade of the Coast and Ports of Spain from Gijon to the French Territory; and that the same will be maintained and enforced in the strictest Manner, according to the Usages of War acknowledged and allowed in similar Cases.

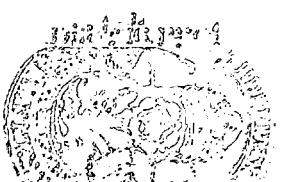
