**R**EAR-ADMIRAL SIR RICHARD STRACHAN has transmitted to John Wilson Croker, Esq. a Letter from Captain Mounsher, of His Majesty's Sloop Drake, giving an Account of his having, on the 7th Instant, driven a large French Privateer Schooner on Shore near Camperdown, where she bilged.

And also a Letter from Captain Hawtayne, commanding the Quebec, reporting the Capture of a French Privateer Schuyt, of Four Guns, cut out on the 16th Instant near the Texel, under a heavy Fire of Musquetry from the Shore, by the Boats of the Idas and King George Cutters.

**T**HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to bear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly; and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for settling and securing a certain Annuity on Viscount Wellington, and the two next Persons to whom the Title of Viscount Wellington shall descend, in consideration of his eminent Services.

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act to continue and amend Three Acts, for the Improvement of the Port and Harbour of Drogheda.

An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of Two Acts of His present Majesty, so far as the same relate to the Road from Buckland Dinham to Radford Bridge, and from Midlmer Norton to Norron Saint Phillip, and from Kilmerston to Radstock, in the County of Somerset.

An Act for continuing the Term and amending Two Acts passed in the Twenty-ninth and Thirty-fifth Years of His present Majesty, for amending the several Roads therein described, so far as the said Acts relate to the District of Road from Bury to Harlingden, and from thence to Blackburn and Whalley, all in the County Palatine of Lancaster; and also for making a Branch of Road from Portfield to the West End of the Town of Padham, in the same County.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts passed in the Tenth and Twentieth Years of His present Majesty, for repairing and widening several Roads leading from the Town of Louth, in the County of Lincoln.

An Act for repairing, altering, and improving the Road from Titchfield to Cosham, in the County of Southampton.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts passed in the Twenty-ninth and Thirty-third Years of His present Majesty, for repairing and widening the Road from Wakefield to Abberford, in the County of York.

An Act for continuing the Term and altering the Powers of an Act made in the Thirty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, for making and repairing several Roads leading across the County of Stirling.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road from the Bottom of Whitefleet Hill to the Wilton Turnpike Road, at or near Barford, in the County of Wilts.

An Act for repairing the Road leading from the Eynsford Turnpike Road, in the Parish of Shoreham, in the County of Kent, to the Turnpike Road leading from Sevenoaks to Bromley, in the said County.

And Eight Private Acts.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Royal Marine Forces, while on Shore.

An Act to continue until the Twenty-fifth Day of March 1811, so much of an Act of the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty as allows a Bounty on British Plantation Raw Sugar exported.

An Act for making perpetual certain of the Provisions of an Act of the Fifth Year of King George the First, for preventing the clandestine running of uncustomed Goods, and for preventing Frauds relating to the Customs.

An Act to continue until the 25th Day of March 1815, several Laws relating to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries.

An Act to continue until the 25th Day of March 1812, an Act made in the Forty-sixth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation of Malts, Yards, Bowsprits, and Timber for naval Purposes, from the British Colonies in North America, Duty free.

An Act to continue an Act made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Exportation of Salt from the Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, the Port of Exuma, and the Port of Crooked Island, in the Bahama Islands, in American Ships coming in Ballast; and amend and continue an Act made in the Forty-eighth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting Sugar and Coffee to be exported from His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations to any Port in Europe, to the
