Diffeinline and Worthin the our Mother (in Doctrine, Discipline and Worship, the b the and nearest to the Primitive Institution) is fet at naughr, slighted and reviled : when busite Men will stretch beyond their Lift, Impose the crude Refults of their Common Councils on Your Maj. Hy, and forget Your molf Gracious Aft of Oblinion; We cannot but be very apprehentive, and fear (for how can we doubt the Defign when Men tread the fame paths, and of-fend again on the fame wicked Principles?) a Refolution of those exream Miferies, which Almighty God in his Mercy to the Nation, by his own immediate hand, in the happy mira-culous Rettauration of Your Majelfy, delivered us from. That therefore Your Majelfy may be the better enabled to Protect and Defend our Religion by Law eltablifhed, the mitchiefs we juffly fear may (as much as in us lies) be prevented) Your Majettics Sacred Perfon, Your juft Rights and Prerogatives, the Succeffion of Your Imperial Crown to Your lawful Heirs, according to the known Laws of this Kingdom, preferred; and the Perfons, Fitates, Liberties and Lives of Your good Subjects may be fate from Arbitrary Government, which Your Maj.tfly refolves againft; We prefent Your Majefty, and be-feech You to accept the tender of our Hearts and Hands, Lives and Fortunes. And we befeech the Almighty God to give Your Majefty his Protection, Grant You Jong Life, and Your Maj thy, and forget Your molt Gracious Att of Obtivion; Lives and Portules. And we beleech the Almighty Goa to give Your Majefty his Protection, Grant You long Life, and a happy and peaceable Reign over us. Which is the leaft we can do for fo Good, Merciful, and Juft a King; and Declare our Selves in all Humility of Heart and Soul, Your Majefties most Dutiful, Loyal, and Obedient Subjects till death.

Por which, as alfo of the further affurance Your Majefty therein gives us of Your Royal Intentions to call frequent Parliaments, and all other Your Princely Refolutifrequent Parliaments, and all other Your Princely Reloluti-ons, in Your faid Gracious Declaration expressed we do, (as in all duiful Allegiance bound) Render unto Your Majefty our most hearty and unfeigned Thanks; and with all hum-ble submission acquiesce in Your Majesties Great Wildom and Council, and when it shall please Your Majesty to call an-other Parliament, shall endeavour to choole such Represen-tatives, as may comply with Your Majesty, in the support and preservation of the Government, as a is now by Law eftablifled; affuring Your Majefty, that as we were the fir Corporation in Englimd, wherein Your Majefty was first pro-claimed King of these Your Majefties Kingdoms; we shall al-ways continue the like Affection at d' Loyalty to Your Maje-fty, and chearfully and readily manifeld the fame upon all occations for Your Majefties Honour and Service, to the ur-meth of any line and Phase. most of our Lives and Estates.

TE rour Majesties most Loyal, Obedient, and truly faithful Subjects, being deeply sensible of the Invasions that have been made upon Your Majesties Government, tending no less to the violation of Tour Laws, than the apparent bazard of Tour Sacred Person, our Lives and Religion, do with all Reverence and Humility profirate our felves at Your Royal feet, rendring our most grateful acknowledgments for these Tour Princely and unwearied Endeavours, that by the Bleffing of the Almighty we have seen so effectual in pre-venting the unnatural Attempts of these Your Majesties and the Kingdoms Enemies; more especially for Your late most gracious Declaration, whereby Your Majelly bath given such unquestionable affurances of maintaining the effablished Religion, our just Liberties and Proper-ties, that (notwithstanding the malicious endeavours and detractions of ill men) have most justily acquired You the Loyal and Sincere Affections of Your People. In return to thefe Your Majesties most gracious Condiscentions, we cannot better express the true sentiments of our Duty and Gratitude, than by humbly afforing Your Sacred Majesty, that we shall always pay that O-bedience that may justly be expected from Loyal Subjects to the best of Kings, and likewise most Religiously and faithfully perform these Obligations of Allegiance we acknowledge indifpensably due to Your Crown and Royal Dignity: Neither hall the bloody designs of Papists, or the bold and infolent behaviour of Factious and Fanati-cal persons cause us in the least to recede from these our fixed and setled Determinations; it being the unanimous Resolution of us Your Majesties most Ob dient Subjects of this Your Loyal County, To facrifice our dearest Blood, our Lives and Fortunes, for preferving Your Sacred Perfon, Your Lawful Heirs and Successfors, the present Constitutions both in Church and State, as the only expedients for continuing these inestimable Blessings we now enjoy under Tour Majesties most Religious and happy Government.
