*Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir James Saumarez, K. B. to John Wilson Croker, Esq; dated on board His Majesty's Ship Victory, in Hawke Roads, Gottenburg, May 28, 1810.*

**H**IS Majesty's Sloop Woodlark, on the 26th Instant, chased on Shore and destroyed a Danish Cutter Privateer, off Hadstrand, mounting Eight Twenty-four Pounder Carronades, with a Crew of Thirty-five Men, under the Protection of the Enemy's Batteries and Armed Vessels.

**V**ICE-ADMIRAL SIR JAMES SAUMAREZ has transmitted to John Wilson Croker, Esq; a Letter he had received from Captain Robinson, of His Majesty's Sloop Prometheus, giving an Account of his having captured at the Entrance of the Sound, on the 24th of last Month, Two Danish Privateers, one a Luggier, of Three Guns and Twenty Men, and the other a Schooner of Three Guns and Sixteen Men, both of which had been out about a Fortnight, without making any Capture.

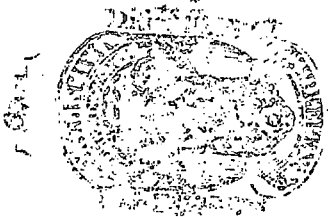
