to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commisfioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majesty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles fo exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the faid Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the faid Articles during the same Season; and provided also that the Exportation of the said Articles shall, in no Case, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the fame Season: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respec-W. HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the 18th of October last, to direct that all such Ships or Vessels as were or should be bound to the Port of Liverpool, or any Creek or Place belonging to or within the faid Port, from any Place or Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed, should perform their Quarantine in Bromborough Pool, instead of Highlake, as prescribed by His Majesly's Order in Council of the 5th of April 1805; and whereas, it is deemed expedient that the faid Order of the 18th of October last should not be confined to Ships or Veffels liable to Quarantine, bound to the Port of Liverpool, or any Creek or Place belonging to or within the faid Port, but should be extended to Ships and Vessels, liable to Quarantine as aforesaid, bound to the Ports of Carlifle, Whitehaven, Lancaller, Preston, Chester, Beaumaris, and the isle of Man, and any Creeks or Places belonging to or within any or either of the above Ports, which Ships or Vessels are directed by His Majesty's said Order in Council of the 5th of April 1805, to perform

their Quarantine at Highlake, or at Milford Haven; His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, that not only all such Ships and Vessels as are or shall be bound to the Port of Liverpool, or any Creek or Place belonging to or within the said Port, but also all Ships and Vessels bound to the Ports of Carlisse, White-haven, Lancaster, Preston, Chester, Beaumaris, and the Isle of Man, and any Creek or Place belonging to or within any or either of the said Ports, shall in suture perform their Quarantine at Bromborough Pool, instead of Highlake or at Milsord Haven. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fecond Day of November last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next! And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of June next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majelty to reltrain the carrying Coastwife of " Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or " Ammunition:"-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Mejesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
