And His Majesty has been further pleased to command, that His Majefty's faid Conceffion and Declaration be registered, together with the relative Documents, in His College of Arms.

Always endeavouring to inculcate by Precept and Example among our numerous Congregations the Principles civil and religious professed by the Church of Scotland at the glorious Revolution, and at the happy Acceflion of the illustrious House of Hanover; we daily pray, that the God by whom Kings reign and Princes decree Juffice may long preferve Your, Majefty's Perfon, and blefs Your Majefty's Government.

With Hearts full of Gratitude to the Great Preferver of Men, we congratulate Your Majefty on the Enjoyment of a Jubilee Year of Your Reign, and we anticipate the Pleafure with which the future Hiftorians of Your Majefty's long and aufpicious Reign will tell admiring Posterity, that in an Ager replete with Events the molt awtul, Your Majetty's Government was, by the Favour of the Lord of Hofts, made the Bulwark of those civil and religious Rights which a bold Ufurper and an infatuated

People fought to defiroy. We beg Leave to affure Your Majefty of the Happinels with which we behold Your Majefty's Councils, Fleets, and Atmies prospered by the Providence of God; and Your Majetty's Subjects enjoying in a Degree beyond that of the other Nations of the Earth, all the Bleffings of Religion, Liberty,

Literature, Commerce, and Wealth, fo that, confident in the Divine Goodness, we cherish the Hope, that the Almighty who has made Your Majefty a Shelter to the Church by his Power, will yet encrease Your Majefty's Greatnels, and baffle all the Defigns of fuch as wickedly frive to fhake the Throne of Your Majefty's United Empire.

Your Majefty will vouchfafe to receive our fincere Congratulations on the merciful Escape and Recoof His Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberverv land from the Blows of an ungrateful Affaffin; may he, and every Branch of Your Royal Houfe, be ever fhielded from the Arrow that flieth by Day, and from the Peftilence that walketh in Darknefs.

That Your Majefty and Your Royal Houfe may long fill the Throne of Your illustrious Anceftors, and in the last great Day receive Crowns glorious and immortal, is, and ever shall be the Prayer of us Your Majefty's dutiful and loyal Subjects.
