**W**HEREAS by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Great Britain, bearing Date the 8th Day of October, in the Fiftieth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, a Charter was granted for the said Borough of Maldon, and the same was proclaimed, read, and accepted in the said Borough, on Monday the 22d Day of October last past:
