Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Drury, Com-mander in Chief of His Mojesty's Ships and Vessels in the East-Indies, to John Weison Croker, Esq. dated on board the Cornelia, in Madras Rouds, July 12,

EXPERIENCE much Pleasure in forwarding to you, for the Information of the Right Ho-nourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Copies of Two Letters received from Lieutenant Augustus Vere Drury, commanding His Majesty's Cutter Sylvia, detailing the Circumstances attending the Capture of a Dutch National Brig, of Eight Guns, with Two Transports, and the Destruction of Three Piratical Prows; and feel happy in the Opportunity of being able to express my Approbation of the Conduct and distinguished Gallantry of this old and deferring Officer, which reflects on him the highest Credit, and will, I trust, recommend him to their Lordships.

The Echo is the Thirteenth Vessel of Force which has recently been taken from the Enemy on the

Coast of Java.

His Majesty's Cutter Sylvia, off Angra Point, April 20, 1810. PROCEEDING through the Straits of Sunda, Three separate Attempts were made, by Armed Prows, to stop the Progress of His Majelly's Cutter under my Command; the Polition taken by these Veffile was close to the lile of Cracatoa, one of whom, on the 6th Instant, swept out to the Sylvia, but was from drove on fliore, taken possession of, and finally deflroyed, after taking out One Six-Pounder. On the 7th Inflant an Armed Prow, of large Dimensions, advanced so close to His Majetty's Cutter, that I judged it necessary to deviate from my Course and destroy this Firate which resolutely approached. A Boat, under the Command of an Officer, and a Party of Volunteers, proceeded to harrass the Enemy, who now endeavoured to escape, but was prevented by the brisk Fire of Mussketry has by the described Party, which took not kept up by the detached Party, which took pof-Kan without fuftaining the fmallest Loss.

On the 11th Instant a large Lugger, at Anchor under Cracatoa, was seen to get under Weigh, her Movement indicating an hossile Intention; I therefore equipped the Prize, gave her in Command to Mr. Chesnaye, who resolutely met the Enemy's Approach, compelling him to feek Safety by Flight; an Island intervening caused us to lose Sight of the Enemy, therefore weighed Anchor and stood out for the Purpose of Supporting the Volunteers, who, I faw on the Sylvia coming up, were on the Point of boarding; the obtinate Refusal of the Enemy to yield, compelled me to open and continue a defiructive Fire until the Lugger funk.

Herewith I have the Honour to transmit you a List of Killed and Wounded, with a Description of

His Majesly's Cutter Sylvia, off Middleburgh SIR, Island, April 27, 1810. I HAVE the Honour to mention to your Ex-

collency, that on the 26th Inflant, at Break of Day, Three Armod Brigs with Two Lug-Sail Veffels were different under Sail in the Vicinity of Edam Island, hastening towards Batavia. Measures were instantly taken to intercept the Sternmost Vessels, hy bringing to close Action the Dutch National Brig D'Echo, of Eight Six-Pounders and Forty-fix Men, commanded by Lieutenant Christian Thaarup, who surrendered to His Majesty's Cutter after a fharp Contell of Twenty Minutes, having Three killed and Seven wounded, ourfelves fuffaining a Lofs of Four Men killed and Three wounded.

The Instant that a Separation between the Sylvia and her Prize could be effected, Pursuit was given to the Headmost Brigs, which, aided by a favourable Breeze and intervening Shoals, effected their Escape to the Batteries of Unruft, leaving His Majesty's

Cutter to take possession of Two Transports, mounting Two Nine-Pounders and defended by Sixty Men each; out Twelve Days from Sourabaya, laden with Artillery Equipage and valuable European Goods.

Sub-Lieutenant Chesnaye's Conduct in this Affair, and throughout the whole Cruize, has been highly meritorious, I therefore beg leave to recommend him to your Excellency as a brave young Officer.

The inferior Officers and Seamen evinced the greatest Define of bringing the whole of the Enemy's Force to Action, although much weakened by a Deficiency of Twelve Men, rendered incapable by Wounds received on a recent Occasion with some desperate Pirates.

Northumberland at Sea,
My LORD, November 22, 1810.

HAVE the Honour to acquaint your Lordship, that His Majesty's Ship Northumberland under my Command, (with the Armada in Company) has captured this Day the French Privateer, Ketch, La Glaneuse, of Fourteen Guns, and having ou board Eighty-sive Men, after a Second Pursuit, having chaced her Yesterday and prevented one of His Majesty's Post-Office Packets from falling into her Power.

She belonged to St. Maloes, was commauded by Mr. Andrè Haite, a Dane, had been Six Weeks at Sea on her first Cruize, without making any Captures; and being a new Vessel, only Six Months old, coppered and Sails very well, she appears to be particularly well adapted to be employed in His Majesty's Service as a Dispatch Vessel.
