DISPATCH, of which the following is a A DISPATCH, of which the following is a Copy, was received laft Night at the Office of the Earl of Liverpool from Lieutenant-General Vifcount Wellington; dated Cartaxo, December 8, 1810.

My Lorn,

'HE Detachment of the Enemy's Troops commanded by General Gardanne, which had returned to Sobreira Formola, have continued their March to the Frontier, and by the last Accounts had entered Spain.

I have not heard that this Detachment had any Communication with the Enemy's Troops on the Left of the Zezere, from whom they were diftant about Three Leagues. 1 understand that, having loft fome Prifoners taken by a Patrole and by a Party of the Ordenanza which accompanied the Honourable Lieutenant-Colonel Ponfonby on a Reconnoif-fance from Abrantes to the River Codes, they made very particular Enquiries respecting the Position of Lieutenant-General Hill's Corps, and the Means which the Allics posseful of croffing the Tagus at Abrantes; and, having commenced their March from Cardigos towards the Codes in the Morning, they retired about Eleven with great Precipitation, and continued their Retreat in the lame

Manner till they reached the Feontier. They were followed by the Ordenanza, who did them much Milchief on the March, and took much Baggage from them. The Enemy deftroyed many Hories and Mules which could not keep up with them; and this March, if it was ordered by fuperior Authority, and is connected with any other Arrangement, had every Appearance, and was attended by all the Confequences, of a precipitate and forced Retreat.

No Alteration of any Importance has been made in the Pention of the Enemy's Troops fince I addreffed your Lordfhip. I have, &c.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Douglas of His Ma-jefty's Ship Bellona, addreffed to Vice-Admiral Sir Edguard Pellegu, Bart. and transmitted by the latter to John Wilfon Croker, Efg.

SIR, Bellona, at Sea, December 18, 1819, BEG leave to inform you that about Ten o'Glock this Morning, the Texel bearing East by South I this Morning, the Texel bearing Latt by South Pourteen Leagues, we gave Chace to an Armed Veffel, carrying a Prefs of Sail to the Northward, and at Twelve o'Clock we captured the French Schooner Privateer Le Heros du Nord, belonging to Dunkirk, mounting Twelve Two-Pounders, and Two Twelve Pound Carronades, and Forty-four Men on board; Monfieur Pierre Malfoi, acting Commander. She left the Brill laft Evening, and had made no Canture. had made no Capture
