The coloured Light being lefs powerful may not be feen when the bright Light is first noticed, but the periodical Revolution of the bright Light will be fufficiently diffinguishable.

In thick and foggy Weather a Bell will be tolled, by Machinery, Night and Day, at Intervals of Half a Minute.




