REAR-ADMIRAL OTWAY has transmitted to John Wilson Croker, Esq; a Letter from Lieutenant Crow, commanding His Majesty's Gun-Vessel Gallant, giving an Account of his having, on the 2d of last Month, captured, on the Coast of Norway, the Danish Privateer the Restorateur, of Six Twelve-Pounders and Nineteen Men.

Notice is hereby given, that Application will be made to Parliament in the present Session, for Leave to bring in a Bill and to obtain an Act to enable certain Persons, to be therein named as Trustees, to erect a Bridge over the River Ebbw, at a certain Place called Pont Ebbw, on the High Road leading from Newport, in the County of Monmouth, to Cardiff, in the County of Glamorgan, which will reach and extend from and out of the Parish of Saint Woollos into the Parish of Bassalleg, both in the said County of Monmouth, the present Bridge being ruinous, dangerous, and in decay; and for enabling such Persons, so to be named Trustees, to borrow and raise a sufficient Sum of Money to erect such Bridge, and to take thereat certain Tolls on all Persons, Carriages, Horses, and Cattle that shall travel over the said Bridge, until the Sums so to be borrowed shall be paid to the several Persons who shall advance the same; and also for erecting one Toll-House on the Land of Sir Charles Morgan, Bart. on the Western Side of the said River Ebbw, at the Extremity of the said intended Bridge.—January 21, 1811.
