Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Bertie, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at the Cape of Good Hope, to John Wilson Croker, Esq. dated on board His Majesty's Ship the Africaine, St. Paul's, Isle of Bourbon, the 13th Oct. 1810.

POLLOWING the Intentions communicated by my Letter addressed to you of the 26th August, I have the Honor now to acquaint you, for the Information of their Lordships, that having made the necessary Dispositions and Arrangements previous to my Departure from the Cape, I hoisted my Flag on board the Nisus, and sailed on the 4th Ultimo, in that Ship for the Isle of France. Having made the Land on the 2d Instant, I proceeded to reconnoitre Port South East, and from thence to Port Louis; where, having cruized forty-eight hours, and not falling in with any Ship of the blockading Squadron, I proceeded to this Anchor-age for Information of them, where I found lying His Majesty's Ships Boadicea, Otter, and Staunch Gun-Brig, together with His Majesty's Ships Afri-
