Gentlemen of the Houfe of Commons,

WE are directed to acquaint you, that His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has given His Commands that the Effimates for the Expenditure of the current Year should be laid before you; and His Royal Highness has great Satisfaction in acquainting you, that although the Difficulties under which the Commerce of this Kingdom has laboured, have in fome Degree affected a Part of His Majelty's Revenue, particularly in Ireland, yet that the Revenue of Great Britain in the laft Year, though unaided by any new Taxation, is greater than was ever known in any preceding Year. And His Royal Highness trufts to your Zeal and Liberality to afford His Majefty adequate Supplies for the Support of the great Contest in which He is necessarily engaged.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

We are commanded by His Royal Highnefs to declare to you, that it is the moft anxious Wifh of His Heart, that He may be enabled to reftore unimpaired into the Hands of His Majefty the Government of HisKingdom; and that His Royal Highnefs earneftly prays, that the Almighty may be pleafed in His Mercy to accelerate the Termination of a Calamity fo deeply lamented by the whole Nation, and fo peculiarly afflicting to His Royal Highnefs Himfelf.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twentieth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and ten, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rolin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, has expired : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majelty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majefty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Per-fon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order, prelume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Maîts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An " Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Expor-" tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and " Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation " or Order in Council:" But it is neverthelefs His Royal Highnefs's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majefty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy ; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Use of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majelly's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies : Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Pur-poles of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majetty's
