VIC ADMIRAL BERTIE, Commander in Chief at the Cape, has transmitted to John Wilson Croker, Esq; a Letter from Captain Paterfon, of His Majesty's Sloop Hesper, giving an Account of the Capture, on the 15th of November last, of the Mouche French national Schooner, bound to the Isle of France with Dispatches, by the Hesper's Cutter, under the Directions of acting Lieutenant James Nixon. She was carried by boarding, in which Mr. Nixon and Two Seamen were wounded, and on the Side of the Enemy Two Men killed and Five wounded, including amongst the latter the Officer commanding the Schooner.
