**WE**, taking into Our most serious Consideration the just and necessary War in which His Majesty is engaged, and putting Our Trust in Almighty God, that He will graciously bless His Majesty's Arms, both by Sea and Land, have resolved, and do, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, hereby command, That a Publick Day of Fasting and Humiliation be observed throughout those Parts of the United Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Wednesday the Twentieth Day of March next ensuing, that so both We and His Majesty's People may humble Ourselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and in the most devout and solemn Manner send up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Provocations have most justly deserved; and for imploring His Blessing and Assistance on His Majesty's Arms for the Restoration of Peace, and Prosperity to His Majesty and His Dominions: And We do strictly charge and command, That the said Publick Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all His Majesty's loving Subjects in England and Ireland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of such Punishment as may be justly inflicted on all such as contemn and neglect the Performance of so religious and necessary a Duty: And for the better and more orderly solemnizing the same, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England and Ireland, to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Publick Worship,

and to take care that the same be timely dispersed throughout their respective Dioceses.

may be justly inflicted on all such as contemn and neglect the Performance of so religious and necessary a Duty: Our Will is, therefore, and We charge, That this Our Proclamation seen, ye forthwith proceed to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in His Majesty's Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleasure is, That His Majesty's Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be sent to the Sheriffs of the several Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to see the same published; and We do appoint them to send Copies hereof to the several Parish Churches within their Bounds; and that, upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the same may be published, and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

AT the Court at Carlton-House, the 8th Day of February 1811,

P R E S E N T,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Fifteenth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and nine, for the Payment of the Bounties for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and the Rewards for discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, so that such Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service; and also the Rewards to Persons who should procure the voluntary Service of Able and Ordinary Seamen, and Landmen, fit for His Majesty's Naval Service, and should convey such Seamen and Landmen on board any of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men, has expired; which Bounties and Rewards are as follows, that is to say, To every Able Seaman not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should enter himself to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, a Bounty of Five Pounds; and to every Ordinary Seaman so entering himself, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, a Bounty of Two Pounds Ten Shillings; to every Able-bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, so entering himself, a Bounty of Thirty Shillings; to every Person or Persons who shall discover any Able or Ordinary Seaman or Seamen who may have concealed him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majesty's Officers employed to raise Men, a Reward of Three Pounds for every such Able Seaman, and Fifty Shillings for every such Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships;

to any Person or Persons who shall procure the voluntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen or Landmen fit for His Majesty's Service, and shall convey them on board any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men, a Reward of Three Guineas for every such Able Seaman, Two Guineas for every such Ordinary Seaman, and One Guinea for every such Landman, together with an Allowance, at the Rate of One Penny per Mile, for each Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile such Men may respectively travel to the nearest of His Majesty's Ships of War, or nearest Place of Residence of any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men; provided such Man shall be found fit for His Majesty's Service, and there shall not be Reason to suppose that he is an Apprentice: And whereas it is expedient that the said several Bounties, Rewards, and Travelling Allowance should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Payment of the said Bounties, Rewards, and Travelling Allowance be continued to the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and eleven, inclusive; and that the same be paid in the Manner specified in His Majesty's several Proclamations now in Force for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and for the discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, and for giving Rewards for procuring the voluntary Service of Seamen and Landmen; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Josias Rowley, late of His Majesty's Ship Boadicea, to J. W. Croker, Esq; Secretary to the Admiralty, dated in London this Day.

## SIR,

IN reply to your Letter of this Day's Date, transmitting to me a Copy of a Letter from Captain Peter Parker, of His Majesty's Ship Menelaus, requesting that a Reference may be made to me with regard to the Proceedings of that Ship in the late Operations at the Isle of France, her Name not appearing in the Dispatch from Vice-Admiral Bertie, as having been present on that Occasion, and signifying to me their Lordships' Directions to report to them what I may know of the Circumstances of the Case; I beg Leave to state my full Persuasion that the Omission of the Name of the Menelaus, in the Vice-Admiral's Dispatch, was entirely accidental; that she joined the Squadron previous to any Operations being undertaken for an Attack on the Island; that upwards of One Hundred Seamen and Marines of her Crew were landed to co-operate with the Troops; and that Captain Parker having been employed under my immediate Direction off Port Louis, I am happy to have an Opportunity of bearing Testimony to the distinguished Zeal and Ability of his Conduct.

*Copy of a Letter from Lieutenant Richard Barton, acting in the temporary Command of His Majesty's Ship the Blanche, addressed to Captain Flint of the Wilhelmina, and transmitted by Vice-Admiral Drury to John Wilson Croker, Esq.*

*His Majesty's Ship Blanche, Port Cornwallis, SIR, Prince of Wales's Island, Aug. 2, 1810.*

I BEG Leave to acquaint you, for the Information of his Excellency the Commander in Chief, that on the 26th Ult. in Latitude  $5^{\circ} 20'$  North, Longitude  $98^{\circ} 22'$  East, I had the Satisfaction of falling in with, and after a chase of Eight Hours, captured La Confiance French Privateer, of Two long Six-Pounders and a Quantity of small Arms, having on board a Complement of Thirty Men. The Confiance sailed from the Isle of France in May last, and had made Two or Three Captures.
