Copy of a Letter from Captain Adderley, of His Majesty's Sloop the *Echo*, addressed to Vice-Admiral Campbell, and transmitted by the latter to John Wilson Croker, Esq.

His Majesty's Sloop Echo, Downes,

S I R,

23d February 1811.

I BEG Leave to inform you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, of my having on the 21st Instant, at Eight A. M. in Latitude 49° 49' North, Longitude 7° 6' West, fallen in with the Constance French Schooner Privateer, of Sixteen Guns, (Fourteen of which she threw overboard in the Chase), and Sixty-two Men, and after a Chase of Eight Hours, blowing hard, discovered Two Ships a-head, which the Chase observing altered her Course, and we immediately succeeded in capturing her. She appears to be a very fine Copper-bottomed Vessel, sails remarkably fast, and is well calculated for His Majesty's Service.
