THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, assembled by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts passed upon by both Houses; do before the immediate Attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for punishing Munity and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Royal Marine Forces while on Shore.

An Act for taking an Account of the Population of Great Britain, and of the Increase or Diminution thereof.

An Act to amend Two Acts of the Thirteenth and Thirty-second Years of His present Majesty, relating to the Wages of Persons employed in the Silk Manufacture.

An Act for more effectually repairing the Road from the Sessions-House, in the Town of Buckingham, to Hanwell, in the County of Oxford.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of Two Acts of His present Majesty, for repairing and widening the Road from Beverley to the Ferry at Hedsle, and from Malton Guide-Post to the Gravel Pit at Cottingham, in the County of York.

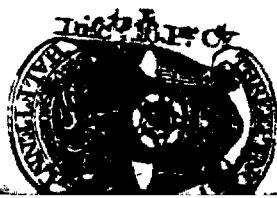
