**T**HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for further continuing until the 25th Day of March 1812, certain Bounties and Drawbacks on the Exportation of Sugar from Great Britain, and for suspending the countervailing Duties and Bounties on Sugar, when the Duties imposed by an Act of the Forty-ninth Year of His present Majesty shall be suspended; and for continuing so much of an Act of the Twenty-seventh Year of His present Majesty as allows a Bounty upon Double-refined Sugar exported until the 25th Day of March 1813, and so much of the same Act as allows a Bounty on Raw Sugar exported until the 25th Day of March 1812.

An Act to continue until the 25th Day of March 1812 an Act for regulating the Drawbacks and Bounties on the Exportation of Sugar from Ireland.

An Act to continue several Laws relating to the granting a Bounty upon certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported from Great Britain, and taking off the Duties on the Importation of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax into Great Britain until the 25th Day of March 1821; to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation into Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty during the Continuance of the War, and until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace; and to the permitting the Importation of Tobacco into Great Britain from any Place whatever until the 25th Day of March 1812.

An Act to continue until the 25th Day of March 1832 certain Acts of the Parliament of Ireland, so far as the same relate to the Duty on Coals imported into the Harbour of Dublin, and to the regulating the Coal-Trade thereof.

An Act to continue until the 25th Day of March 1833 certain Acts of the Parliament of Ireland, so far as the same relate to the Improvement of the City of Dublin, by making wide and convenient Passages through the same.

An Act for lighting, watching, and improving the Streets and other public Passages within the Town of Ware, in the County of Hertford.
