THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Melfage was fent to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by the Yeoman Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorifed by virtue of a Commiftion under the Great Seal, figned by the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Bebalf of His Majely, for declaring His Majely's Royal Affent to feveral Alls agreed upon by both Houfes, an defire the immediate Attendance of the Honourable Houfe in the Houfe of Peers to hear the Commiftion read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for further continuing until the 25th Day of March 1812, certain Bounties and Drawbacks on the Exportation of Sugar from Great Britain, and for fufpending the countervailing Duties and Bounties on Sugar, when the Duties imposed by an Act of the Forty-ninth Year of His prefent Majesty shall be fufpended; and for continuing so much of an Act of the Twenty-feventh Year of His prefent Majesty as allows a Bounty upon Double-refined Sugar exported until the 25th Day of March 1813, and fo much of the fame Act as allows a Bounty on Raw Sugar exported until the 25th Day of March 1812.

An Act to continue until the 25th Day of March 1812 an Act for regulating the Drawbacks and Bounties on the Exportation of Sugar from Ireland.

An Act to continue feveral Laws relating to the granting a Bounty upon certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported from Great Britain, and taking off the Duties on the Importation of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax into Great Britain until the 25th Day of March 1821; to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation into Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty during the Continuance of the War, and until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace; and to the permitting the Importation of Tobacco into Great Britain from any Place whatever until the 25th Day of March 1812.
