His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America; and between His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorise, or by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Time being, to authorise, in case of Necessity, the Im-

portation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the said United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the ensuing Season only; provided always, that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported, except in conformity to such Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law.

And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn and Live Stock, and also Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent doth thereupon, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn and Live Stock, and also Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine may be imported into the said Island from any of the Territories belonging to the said United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of such Importation, have cleared out from some Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly

authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinafter mentioned; which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which such Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Royal Highness is hereby further pleased to order, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel, to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the said Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the said Island of Newfoundland, where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Live Stock, Pitch, Tar and Turpentine, deliver up the said Licence to the Collector, or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first endorsed on the Back of such Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Pitch, Tar and Turpentine, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the said Act mentioned; and the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, of his having received the said Licence so endorsed as before directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland respectively, by whom such Licence was granted. *Chetwynd.*

Now be it known, that the said *[Person's Name]*, hath a Licence to lade on board the said Ship, *[Ship's Name]* at and from any Port or Place belonging to the United States of America, Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, and also Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, the Produce of the said United States, and no other Article whatsoever; and to carry the said Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Live Stock, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine to some Port or Place in the Island of Newfoundland; and on the Arrival of the said Ship at any Port, Harbour, or Place of Discharge in Newfoundland, the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of the said Ship, is required and enjoined to deliver up the said Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of His Majesty's Customs there, and to indorse on the Back thereof the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, and the Number of Live Stock, and shall thereupon receive a Certificate thereof from the said Collector, or other proper Officer of the Customs.

WHEREAS, by virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by sundry Acts of Parliament, His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the 10th of April last, to allow, and did thereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eleven, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain, of certain Articles of Provision, in the Manner and under the Conditions therein mentioned; and whereas by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, Cap. 14, it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation, and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, to continue in Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament," which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesty, and amended and further continued by several subsequent Acts

until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eleven, shall, from and after the said Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eleven, be, and the same is thereby further continued during the Continuance of the War, and until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and Twelve, the Importation, into any Port or Place of Great Britain, of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans; Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork;) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be imported, with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the said above-recited Act, passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. *Chetwynd.*

Copy of a Letter from the Honourable George Cranfield Berkeley, Admiral of the Blue, &c. to John Wilson Croker, Esq; dated at Lisbon, the 8th of March 1811.

SIR,
I HAVE great Pleasure in informing their Lordships of the Evacuation of the strong Post which the Enemy possessed at Santarem, and that our Army are now advancing in Pursuit. Lieutenant Claxton of the Basileur, who commands the Gun-Boats in Co operation with the Division of the Army under Marshal Sir William Beresford on the South Side of the Tagus, Yesterday informed me, that on the Evening of the 5th Instant, in reconnoitring under Santarem, he perceived the Enemy departing; and immediately crossed, with the Officer of the British Piquet, and gave the Intelligence to Lord Wellington. He then went to Santarem, where he found the Enemy had left three rough-built Boats or Pontoons, Two Rafts, and Twelve or Fourteen of their heavy Cannon, the Carriages of which had been burnt. The Army is now moving on, and the

Boats are ordered to follow them up the Tagus, the Navigation of which is now cleared up to Abrantes.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Macnamara, of His Majesty's Ship Berwick, addressed to Admiral Sir Roger Curtis, Bart. transmitted by the latter to John Wilson Croker, Esq.

His Majesty's Ship Berwick, off Cherbourg.

SIR, March 25, 1811.

HAVING sailed from St. Helen's, in His Majesty's Ship under my Command, in the Afternoon of the 23d Instant, I stood over to the French Coast under easy Sail all Night; at Daylight the next Morning, Basileur Light bearing S. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. distant about Twelve or Thirteen Miles, I observed a large Sail S. by E. running along the Shore. I immediately gave Chase, and obliged her to haul in for a small rocky Bay, about one Mile to the Westward of Basileur Light-House, where she anchored with the Loss of her Rudder; at Eight the Lee Tide making strong, I was under the Necessity, to avoid the Rocks and Shoals which surrounded us, to anchor His Majesty's Ship about Two Miles to the Northward of the Enemy, which proved a Frigate of the largest Class. I had previously called in the Amelia Frigate, Goshawk, and Hawk Sloops, and ordered them to anchor, thinking an Attack by Boats practicable when the Weather Tide should make.

At Noon the Niobe joined from the Eastward; the Flood making at Four P.M., the Squadron weighed, and having relinquished the Plan of Attack by Boats, on account of the Rapidity of the Tides, I ordered the Niobe, by Signal, to lead as close to the Enemy as the Safety of the Ships would admit, which was performed with great Judgment, the Amelia and Berwick following in Succession.

Surrounded by Rocks and Shoals our Fire could only be partial in the Act of wearing; at Six P.M. I hauled off, and on standing in this Morning with the Intention of renewing the Attack with Effect, the Enemy set Fire to the Frigate, and I had the Satisfaction of seeing her burn to the Water's Edge.

The Berwick has One Man killed, none wounded; the Amelia One Man killed and One wounded; standing and running Rigging much cut.
