His Royal Highnels the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act paffed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, initialed "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the Weft India Iflands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His Majefty's faid Subjects and the Foreign Iflands in the Weft Indies," it is, amongft other Things, enacled, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majefty in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and publifted from Time to Time, to authorife, or by Wartant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Time heing, to authorife, in cafe of Neceffity, the Im-

portation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corp, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fifhermen of the Iiland of Newfoundland for the enfaing Seafononly; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorifed to be imported into the Ifland of Newfoundland, fhall not be imported, except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions as fhall be fpecified in fuch Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, refpectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law.

And whereas it is expedient and neceffary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Scalon, with Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn and Live Stock, and alfo Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent doth thereupon, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that for the Supply of the Inhabicants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the entuing Seafon only, Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn and Live Stock, and alfo Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine may be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British built Ships owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from some Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majeity's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpole a Licence shall have been granted by the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland. or any other Perfon or Perfons who may be duly

authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinafter mentioned; which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which fuch Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no fuch Licence as aforefaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Royal Highnels is hereby further pleafed to order, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majefty, and by and with the Advice of His Majelty's Privy Council, that the Mafter or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Veffel, to whom fuch Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Veffel at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the faid Island of Newfoundland, where he shall discharge fuch Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Live Stock, Pitch, Tar and Turpentine, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector, or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms there, having first endorfed on the Back of such Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Peale, Indian Corn, Pitch, Tar and Turpentine, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned ; and the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cultoms at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and' required to give a Certificate to the Malter or Person having the Charge or Command of fuch Ship or Veffel, of his having received the faid Licence fo endorfed as before directed, and to transmit the fame to the Commiffioners of His Majelty's Cuftoms in England or Scotland, or to the Commillioners of His Majefty's Revenue in Ireland refpectively, by whom fuch Licence was granted. Now be it known, that the faid [Perfon's Name], hath a Licence to lade on board the faid Ship, [Ship's Name] at and from any Port or Place belonging to the United States of America, Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, and alfo Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, the Produce of the faid United States, and no other Article whatfoever; and to carry the faid Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Live Stock, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine to fome Port or Place in the Island of Newfoundland; and on the Arrival of the faid Ship at any Port, Harbour, or Place of Discharge in Newfoundland, the Mafter or Perfon having the Charge or Command of the faid Ship, is required and enjoined to deliver up the faid Licence to the. Collector or other proper Officer of His Majefty's Cultoms there, and to indorfe on the Back thereof the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, and the Number of Live Stock, and thall thereupon receive a Certificate thereof from the faid Collector, or other proper Officer of the Cultoms.

HEREAS, by virtue of the Powers vefted in His Majefty by fundry Acts of Parliament, His Majelty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the 10th of April laft, to allow, and did thereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thouland eight hundred and eleven, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain, of certain Articles of Provision, in the Manner and under the Conditions therein mentioned; and whereas by an Act, paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, Cap. 14, it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of His prefent Majelty, intituled " An Act for enabling His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation, and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, to continue in Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Seffion of Parliament," which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His prefent Majelty, and amended and further continued by feveral subsequent Acts

entil the Twenty fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eleven, shall, from and after the faid Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eleven, be, and the fame is thereby further continued during the Continuance of the War, and until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace; His Royal Highnels the Prince Regent is thereupon pleafed, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majefty, and by and with the Advice of His Majefty's Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and Twelve, the Importation, into any Port or Place of Great Britain, of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulfe; and also of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Shcep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted

Beef, and Pork,) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any Britifh Ship or Veffel, or in any other Ship or Veffel belonging to Perfons of any Kingdom or Scate in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all fuch Articles as aforefaid, that shall be imported, with the proper Officers of the Cuftoms at the Port where the fame shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the faid above-recited Act, paffed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His prefent Majetty: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majelty's Treafury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. Copy of a Letter from the Honourable George Cranfield Berkeley, Admiral of the Blue, Sc to John Wil-fon Croker, Efq; dated at Lifbon, the 8th of March **์**1811.

SIR,

I HAVE great Pleasure in informing their Lord-fhips of the Evacuation of the flrong Polt which the Enemy possefied at Santarem, and that our Army are now advancing in Pursuit. Lieutenant Claxton of the Baifleur, who commands the Gun-Boats in Co operation with the Division of the Army under Maishal Sir William Beresford on the South Side of the Tagus, Yesterday informed me, that on the Evening of the 5th Inftant, in reconnoitring under Santarem, he perceived the Enemy departing; and immediately croffed, with the Officer of the British Piquet, and gave the Intelligence to Lord Wellington. He then went to Santarem, where he found the Enemy had left three rough-built Boats or Pontoons, Two Rafts, and Twelve or Fourteen of their heavy Cannon, the Carriages of which had been burnt. The Army is now moving on, and the

Boats are ordered to follow them up the Tagus, the Navigation of which is now cleared up to Abrantes. 1 am, &c.

Copy of a Letter from Cuptain Macnamara, of His Majefly's Ship Berwick, addreffed to Admiral Sir Roger Curtis, Bart. transmitted by the latter to John Wilfon Croker, Efq.

His Majefly's Ship Berwick, off Cherbourg,

SIR, March 25, 1811. HAVING failed from St Helen's, in His Ma-jefty's Ship under my Command, in the After-noon of the 23d Inftant, I flood over to the French Coaft under eafy Sail all Night; at Daylight the next Morning, Barfleur Light bearing S. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. diftant about Twelve or Thirteen Miles. I observed a large about Twelve or Thirteen Miles, I observed a large Sail S. by E. running along the Shore. I immediately gave Chafe, and obliged her to haul in for a fmall rocky Bay, about one Mile to the Westward of Barfleur Light-House, where she anchored with the Lofs of her Rudder ; at Eight the Lee Tide making ftrong, I was under the Neceffity, to avoid the Rocks and Shoals which furrounded us, to anchor His Majefty's Ship about Two Miles to the Northward of the Enemy, which proved a Frigate of the largest Class. I had previoully called in the Amelia Frigate, Goshawk, and Hawk Sloops, and ordered them to anchor, thinking an Attack by Boats practicable when the Weather Tide should make.

At Noon the Niobe joined from the Eaftward; the Flood making at Four P. M.; the Squadron weighed, and having relinquilhed the Plan of Attack by Boats, on account of the Rapidity of the Tides, 1 ordered the Niobe, by Signal, to lead as close to the Enemy as the Safety of the Ships would admit, which was performed with great Judgment, the Amelia and Berwick following in Succeffion.

Surrounded by Rocks and Shoals our Fire could only be partial in the Act of wearing; at Six P. M. I hauled off. and on flanding in this Morning with the Intention of renewing the Attack with Effect, the Enemy fet Fire to the Frigate, and I had the Satisfaction of feeing her burn to the Water's Edge. The Berwick has One Man killed, none wounded;

the Amelia One Man killed and One wounded; flanding and running Rigging much cut. I am Sir, &c.


