His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade hetween the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for This Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to authorise, or by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Time being, to authorife, in case of Necessity, the Im-portation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the ensuing Season only; provided always, that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported, except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in fuch Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, re-fpectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Sub-

jects, and navigated according to Law.

And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provition be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn and Live Stock, and also Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent doth thereupon, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season only, Bread,

T the Court at Carlson-House, the 28th of Flour, Pease, Indian Corn and Live Stock, and March 1811, into the faid Island from any of the Territories be-longing to the faid United States, by British Sub-jects, and in British built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of such Importation, have cleared out from some Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majetty's Do-minions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence minions in Europe, for which Purpole a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinatter mentioned; which I icence shall continue and he in Europe for Nicence. Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which such Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Royal Highness is hereby further pleased to order, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel, to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the said Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the said Island of Newsoundland, where he shall discharge stock, Pitch, Tar and Turpentine, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector, or other proper Officer of the Cultoms there, having first endorsed on the Back of such Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Peale, Indian Corn, Pitch, Tar and Turpentine, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned ; und the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, of his having received the faid Licence so endorsed as be-fore directed, and to transmit the same to the Com-missioners of His Majesty's Customs in England on Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's

Revenue in Ireland respectively; by whom such Licence was granted. Chetwynd.

Now be it known, that the faid [Person's Name], hath a Licenceto lade on board the faid Ship, [Ship's Name] at and from any Port or Place belonging to the United States of America, Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, and also Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, the Produce of the faid United States, and no other Article whatsoever; and to carry the said Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Live Stock, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine to some Port or Place in the Island of Newfoundland; and on the Arrival of the said Ship at any Port, Harbour, or Place of Discharge in Newfoundland, the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of the said Ship, is required and enjoined to deliver up the said Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of His Majesty's Customs there, and to indorse on the Back thereof the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, and the Number of Live Stock, and shall thereupon receive a Certificate thereof from the said Collector, or other proper Officer of the Customs.

WHEREAS, by virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by sundry Acts of Parliament, His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council,

bearing Date the roth of April last, to allow, and did thereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eleven, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain, of certain Articles of Provision, in the Manner and under the Conditionstherein mentioned; and whereas by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, Cap. 14, it is enacted that an Act, made in the Thirty-night Year of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation, and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, to con-tique in Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Sellion of Parliament," which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesty, and amended and further continued by several subsequent Acts until the Twenty fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eleven, shall, from and after the faid Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eleven, be, and the same is thereby further continued during the Continuance of the War, and until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majetty's Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and Twelve, the Importation, into any Port or Place of Great Britain, of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and allo of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork,) and of Bacon, Hans, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any Briderick tish Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be imported, with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the faid above recited Act, passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty: And the Kight Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. W HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twentieth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and ten, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron,



Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rolin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Maits, Yards, Bowlprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheel Copper, or other Naval Stores, has expired : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Sasety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Be-half of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majelly's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons who foever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order, prelime to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Auchors, Cables, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade arry Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpenting, Anthory Cobbas, Candusia, Mosta Variae Bourgery, Candustry, Mosta Variae Bourgery, Candustry, Mosta Variae Bourgery, Candustry, Mosta Variae Bourgery, Candustry, Mosta Variae Bourgery, Parks of the Candustry of the tine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Maits, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirtythird Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An " Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Expor-"tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and "Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:" But it is nevertheless His Royal Highness's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Velfel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plan-tations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settle-ments on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majetty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majetty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, (except as here-inafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Com-

missioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are so entered outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Royal Highness's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulius for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majesty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles so exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards; and not for Sale; and that the faid Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the laid Articles during the same Scalon; and provided also that the Exportation of the said Articles shall, in no Case, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settle-ment, whether by one or more Shipments within the same Season: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the ne-cessary Directions herein as to them may respec-W.
