**T**HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for enabling His Majesty to direct the Issue of Exchequer Bills to a limited Amount, for the Purposes and in Manner therein-mentioned.

An Act for granting Annuities to discharge certain Exchequer Bills.

An Act to render valid certain Acts done for completing the Regular Militia, and to indemnify the Persons concerned therein.

An Act to indemnify such Persons in the United Kingdom as have omitted to qualify themselves for Offices and Employments, and for extending the Times limited for these Purposes respectively until the 25th Day of March 1812, and to permit such Persons in Great Britain as have omitted to make and file Affidavits of the Execution of Indentures of Clerks to Attornies and Solicitors to make and file the same on or before the First Day of Hilary Term 1812.

An Act to continue until the 25th Day of March 1812 an Act of the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for appointing Commissioners to enquire into the Public Expenditure, and the Conduct of the Public Business in the Military Departments therein-mentioned, and to extend the same to Public Works executed by the Office of Works and others.

An Act for enabling the Company of Proprietors of the Croydon Canal to raise Money to complete the said Canal and Works, and for amending the former Acts passed relative thereto.

An Act for better paving, lighting, cleansing, watching, and otherwise improving the Town of Bury Saint Edmund's, in the County of Suffolk.

An Act for widening and improving the Street called the Nethergate, in the Burgh of Dundee, in the County of Forfar.

An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of Two Acts of His present Majesty for repairing the Roads from the East Gate of King's Lynn to the North End of Babingley-Lane, and to extend the Road from thence to Darlington, in the County of Norfolk.

ADMIRAL LORD GAMBIER has transmitted to John Wilson Croker, Esq; a Letter from Mr. Hallands, Master of the Fancy Hired Armed Cutter, giving an Account of his having, on the 24th of last Month, captured the Getrowed Batavian Government Schooner, pierced for Fourteen Guns but only Two mounted, bound from Batavia to Holland with Dispatches.

And also a Letter from Captain Parker, of His Majesty's Ship Amazon, reporting the Capture, on the 23d Ultimo, of Le Cupidon French Privateer Brig, of Fourteen Guns and Eighty-two Men, out Two Days from Bayonne.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been graciously pleased, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Sir Isaac Coffin, Baronet, Vice Admiral of the White Squadron of the Fleet. His Majesty's Royal Licence and Authority, that from and after the Solemnization of his Marriage with Elizabeth Brown Greenly, only Child and Heir Expectant of William Greenly, of Titley Court, in the County of Hereford, Esq; by Elizabeth his Wife, Daughter and sole Heir of John Brown, late of Leinthall Earls, in the said County, Esq; deceased, he the said Sir Isaac Coffin, and the Issue of such Marriage, may assume and use the Surname and bear the Arms of Greenly, in addition to the Surname and Arms of Coffin; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office:

And also to order, that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

#### TREASURY CHAMBERS, WHITEHALL.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for permitting certain Goods, imported into Great Britain, to be secured in Warehouses, without Payment of Duty," it is amongst other things enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Consignee or Consignees, of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes enumerated or described in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (A); and which shall have been legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in any Warehouse or Warehouses, situated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock Company, without Payment, at the Time of the first Entry, of the Duties of Customs or Excise, due on the Importation thereof, subject nevertheless to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions directed by the said Act.

Provided always, and it is thereby enacted, that if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of the said Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables thereto annexed, and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Act shall extend and be construed to extend to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize in every respect, in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said Tables respectively at the Time of passing this Act.

We the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to and in Execution of the Powers vested in us, in and by the said Act, do hereby declare that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to Cassia Fistula, legally imported or brought into the Port of London, (not being imported by the United

Company of Merchants of England, trading to the East Indies,) and that such Cassia Fistula should be added to the List of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said recited Act, marked (A), and that such Cassia Fistula should be lodged and secured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant in such Warehouse or Warehouses as aforesaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act: And we do further declare, that from and after the Publication of this our Certificate in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the said Act, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Act, shall extend, and be construed to extend to all such Cassia Fistula in every respect, in as full and ample Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in Table (A) annexed to the said Act, at the Time of the passing the same Act.

**W**HEREAS it hath been humbly represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that in the Night of Monday the 25th Ultimo, about Twelve o'Clock, the Dwelling-House of William Church Norcop, Esq; at Betton, in the Parish of Drayton in Hales, in the County of Salop, was entered by Three Men, dressed in short Smock Frocks, who came into Mr. Norcop's Bed-Room with a lighted Candle, two of them came to his Bed-side, and one of them, holding a large Pistol over him, demanded the immediate Delivery of his Money and Keys, but not permitting him to rise; one of them took his Breeches, which lay on a Chair near the Bed, and rifled the Pockets, taking thereout Two Guineas and some Silver, and also a small Key, with which they attempted to open a Desk in the Room, but not succeeding in unlocking it, two of them wrenched it open, while the third stood over Mr. Norcop, keeping him in Awe in the Bed. They took from the said Desk one Bank of England Bill, Value 50l.; one Bank Post Bill, Value 32l. 18s.; and one other Bank Post Bill, Value 20l. which said two last-mentioned Bills were dated the 15th Day of January last, and made payable to William C. Norcop, Value received of Messrs. Hutton and Co.; they also took several small Bank Notes, amounting to about 10l., and about 30l. in Cash;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in such daring Outrage, is hereby pleased, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually held the Pistol over Mr. Norcop) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
