WHEREAS by an Act paffed in the Forty-third Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for permitting certain Goods, imported into Great Britain, to be fecured in Ware-houfes, without Payment of Duty," it is amongst other things enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees, of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes enumerated or defcribed in the Table thereunto annexed, marked(A); and which shall have been legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to lodge and fecure the fame under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in any Warehouse or Warehouses, situated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock Company, with-out Payment, at the Time of the first Entry, of the Duties of Cuftoms or Excife, due on the Importation thereof, subject nevertheles to the Rules, Re-gulations, and Restrictions directed by the faid Act. Provided always, and it is thereby enacted, that if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, fhall deem it expedient that the Provisions of the faid Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or defcribed in either of the Tables thereto annexed, and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restric-tions of the faid Act shall extend and be construed to extend to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize in every respect, in as full and ample a Manner as if the fame had been inferted and enumerated in the faid Tables respectively at the Time of passing this A&

We the underfigned Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, purfuant to and in Execution of the Powers vefted in us, in and by the faid AA, do hereby declare that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the faid AA fould be extended to Caffia Fiftula, legally imported or brought into the Port of London, (not being imported by the United Norcop.

Company of Merchants of England, trading to the East Indies,) and that fuch Caffia Fistula should be added to the Lift of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated and defcribed in the faid Table annexed to the faid recited Act, marked (A), and that fuch Caffia Fiftula fhould be lodged and fecured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant in fuch Warehoufe or Warehoufes as aforefaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the faid Act: And we do further declare, that from and after the Publication of this our Certificate in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the faid Act, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Reffric-tions of the faid Act, shall extend, and be construed to extend to all fuch Caffia Filtula in every respect, in as full and ample Manner as if the fame had been inferted and enumerated in Table (A) annexed to the faid Act, at the Time of the paffing the fame A&
