THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's*

Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commoas being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to allow a certain Proportion of the Militia of Great Britain to enlist annually into the Regular Forces, and to provide for the gradual Reduction of the said Militia.

An Act to continue and amend an Act of His present Majesty for repairing the Road from Norwich to Aylsham, in the County of Norfolk; and to make and maintain the Road from Aylsham to Cromer, and Part of the Road leading towards Wolterton, branching off from the Cromer Road to the Eagle Inn, in Erpingham, in the said County.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act of His present Majesty for repairing the Road from Dudley to the New Inn, Pattingham; and also the Road from Shut-End, to join the Wolverhampton Turnpike Road, in the Counties of Worcester, Stafford, and Salop.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of several Acts for repairing the Road from Harlow-Bush Common, in the Parish of Harlow, to Woodford, in the County of Essex; and the Road from Epping through the Parishes of Northweald, Bafett, Bobbingworth, High-Ongar, Chipping Ongar, and Shelley, to the Four Want-Way, in the Parish of Shelley; and from thence through the Parishes of High-Ongar and Norton-Mandeville to the Parish of Writtle, in the said County.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, to appoint Charles Maxwell, Esq; to be Governor of the Settlement of Sierra Leone and its Dependencies.

Downing-Street, April 29, 1811.

A DISPATCH, of which the following is an Extract, was Yesterday Evening received from Lieutenant-General Lord Viscount Wellington K. B., by the Earl of Liverpool, dated Goveia, March the 27th, 1811.

WHEN I found that the Enemy retired with such Celerity from Moita, I continued the Pursuit of them with the Cavalry, and the Light Division under Major-General Sir William Erskine only, supporting these Troops with the 6th and 3d Divisions of Infantry, and by the Militia on the Right of the Mondego; and I was induced to halt the Remainder of the Army till the Supplies, which had been sent round from the Tagus to the Mondego, should arrive. This Halt was the more desirable as nothing could be found in the Country, and every Day's March increasing the Distance from the Magazines on the Tagus rendered the Supply of the Troops more difficult and precarious; and the further Advance of the main Body for a few Days did not appear to be necessary.

The Cavalry and Light Troops continued to annoy the Enemy's Rear and to take Prisoners; and the Militia under Colonel Wilson had an Affair with a Detachment of the Enemy, on the 22d, not far from Celorico, in which they killed Seven and wounded several, and took Fifteen Prisoners. The Militia under General Silveira also took some Prisoners on the 25th.

The Enemy retired his Left, the 2d Corps, by Goveia through the Mountains upon Guarda, and the Remainder of the Army by the High Road upon Celorico. They have since moved more Troops upon Guarda, which Position they still hold in Strength. Our Advanced Guard is in Front of Celorico, towards Guarda, and at Alverca, and the 3d Division in the Mountains, and occupying Porco Miserella and Prados.

The Allied Troops will be collected in the Neighbourhood of Celorico To-morrow.

General Ballesteros surprized General Remon, on the 10th, at Palma, and dispersed his Detachment, and took from him Five Hundred Prisoners.

General Ballesteros had since retired to Valverde, and I hear that General Zayas had been detached from Cadiz with Six Thousand Men, including Four Hundred Cavalry to be disembarked at Huelva to join General Ballesteros.

P. S. Since writing the above I have received the Report of a gallant Action of one of our Patrols Yesterday Evening, between Alverca and Guarda, under the Command of Lieutenant Perse of the 16th Light Dragoons, and Lieutenant Foster of the Royals, who attacked a Detachment of the Enemy's Cavalry between Alverca and Guarda, and killed and wounded several of them, and took the Officer and Thirty-seven Men Prisoners.

The Enemy have withdrawn from Pinhel across the Coa.

Foreign-Office, April 12, 1811.

DISPATCHES have this Day been received at this Office from Charles Stuart, Esq; His Majesty's Minister at Lisbon, dated the 30th Ultimo, stating that Sir William Beresford, having united the whole of his Force in Portalegre on the 23d

March, advanced on the 24th, and attacked the Enemy with his Cavalry on the 25th. They were compelled to abandon Campo Maior, with the Loss of Six Hundred Men killed and wounded. On the 26th General Beresford's Head-Quarters were at Elvas.

The Enemy had withdrawn their whole Force, excepting a weak Picquet, to the other side of the Guadiana.

The Corps under Marshal Soult has halted in the Neighbourhood of Llerena

General Ballesteros had returned to Gibraleon, on the 29th, where his Force had been increased by the Arrival of Six Thousand Men under General Zayas.

Marshal Bessieres arrived at Zamora on the 5th of March with Seven Thousand Men.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Bertram, of His Majesty's Sloop the Persian, addressed to Admiral Sir Roger Curtis, Bart., and transmitted by the latter to John Wilson Croker, Esq.

His Majesty's Sloop Persian, off Beachy Head, April 6, 1811.

SIR, BEING off Beachy Head in His Majesty's Sloop Persian under my Command, Yesterday Afternoon at Two P. M. the Signal Station made a Signal for a smuggling Vessel discharging her Cargo in the Offing, between the South and South West; made Sail in Chase; at Half-past Eleven P. M. saw a Lugger on the Lee Bow, steering for the French Coast, and after nearly an Hour's Chase, and firing Two or Three Broadsides, I had the Satisfaction of seeing her lower her Sails and bring to. She proved to be the French Lugger Privateer L' Ambuscade, of Fourteen Guns, with a Complement of Sixty-three Men, but had only Thirty-six on board, (having left the rest on shore,) commanded by Monsieur Nicholas Augustine Briganda, belonging to Dieppe, out Forty Hours, but had not made any Capture.

TREASURY CHAMBERS, WHITEHALL.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for permitting certain Goods, imported into Great Britain, to be secured in Warehouses, without Payment of Duty," it is amongst other things enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Consignee or Consignees, of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes enumerated or described in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (A); and which shall have been legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in any Warehouse or Warehouses, situated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock Company, without Payment, at the Time of the first Entry, of the Duties of Customs or Excise, due on the Importation thereof, subject nevertheless to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions directed by the said Act.

Provided always, and it is thereby enacted, that if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of the said Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables thereto annexed, and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Act shall extend and be construed to extend to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize in every respect, in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said Tables respectively at the Time of passing this Act.

We the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to and in Execution of

the Powers vested in us, in and by the said Act, do hereby declare that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to Cassia Fistula, legally imported or brought into the Port of London, (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants of England, trading to the East Indies,) and that such Cassia Fistula should be added to the List of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said recited Act, marked (A), and that such Cassia Fistula should be lodged and secured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant in such Warehouse or Warehouses as aforesaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act: And we do further declare, that from and after the Publication of this our Certificate in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the said Act, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Act, shall extend, and be construed to extend to all such Cassia Fistula in every respect, in as full and ample Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in Table (A) annexed to the said Act, at the Time of the passing the same Act.

Norcop, Value received of Messrs. Hutton and Co.; they also took several small Bank Notes, amounting to about 10l., and about 30l. in Cash;
