HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's

Royal Affent to several Alls agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Pters to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to allow a certain Proportion of the Militia of Great Britain to enlift annually into the Regular Forces, and to provide for the gradual Reduction of the faid Militia.
