TREASURY CHAMBERS, WHITEHALL.

W HEREAS by an Act paffed in the Forty-third Year of His prefent Majelty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for permitting certain Goods, imported into Great Britain, to be fecured in Ware-houles, without Payment of Duty," it is amongft other things enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignce or Confignees, of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes enumerated or deferibed in the Table thereunto annexed, marked(A); and which shall have been legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to lodge and fecure the fame under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in any Warehoufe or Warehoufes, fituated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the Well India Dock Company, without Payment, at the Time of the first Entry, of the Duties of Cultoms or Excile, due on the Importation thereof, subject nevertheless to the Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions directed by the faid Act.

Provided always, and it is thereby enacted, that if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commiffioners of His Majetty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of the laid Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or defcribed in either of the Tables thereto annexed, and shall caufe a Lift of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Reitric-tions of the faid Act shall extend and be construed to extend to fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize in every respect, in as full and ample a Manner as if the fame had been inferted and enumerated in the faid Tailes respectively at the Time of palling this Act.

We the underfigned Lords Commiffioners of His

the Powers vefted in us, in and by the faid Act, do hereby declare that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the faid Act should be extended to Caffia Fiftula, legally imported or brought into the Port of London, (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants of England, trading to the East Indies,) and that such Cassia Fistula should be added to the Lift of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize coumerated and defcribed in the faid Table annexed to the faid recited A&, marked (A), and that fuch Caffia Fiftula fhould be lodged and fecured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant in fuch Warehoufe or Warehoufes as aforefaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the faid Act: And we do further declare, that from and after the Publication of this our Certificate in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the faid A&, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Refiric-tions of the faid ACt, shall extend, and be construed to extend to all fuch Caffia Filtula in every refpect, in as full and ample Manner as if the fame had been inferted and enumerated in Table (A) annexed to the faid Act, at the Time of the passing the same A&
