

of Quarantine, be put to the Commanders, Masters, or other Persons having Charge of Ships or Vessels coming from or having touched at any Port or Place on the Continent of America, or the Islands adjacent thereto, or coming from or having touched at any of the Ports in the West Indies; and His Royal Highness is further pleased to order, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice aforesaid, That such Commanders, Masters, or other Persons having Charge of such Ships or Vessels, shall, upon such Questions being put by the Superintendent of Quarantine, or his Assistant, or Principal Officer, or other Officer of the Customs, authorized by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, or any Four or more of them, to act in that Behalf, give a true Answer to the same in Writing or otherwise, and upon Oath, or not upon Oath, according as he shall be required by such Superintendent, or his Assistant or Principal Officer, or other Officer of the Customs authorized as aforesaid, under such Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by an Act passed in the Forty-fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making further Provision for the effectual Performance of Quarantine." And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General, and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
