AT the Court at *Carlton-House*, the 28th of February 1811,

P R E S E N T,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His General Order in Council of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, touching the Performance of Quarantine, to direct, that where any Ship or Vessel shall attempt to enter into any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, whether such Port or Place shall have been appointed for the Performance of Quarantine or not, the Superintendent of Quarantine or his Assistant, (if there shall be such Superintendent or Assistant at such Port or Place), or, if not, the Principal Officer of His Majesty's Customs at such Port or Place, or such Officer of the Customs as shall be authorized by the Commissioners of the Customs, or any Four or more of them to act in that Behalf, shall go off to such Ship or Vessel, and shall, at a convenient Distance from such Ship or Vessel, keeping to Windward, demand of the Commander, Master, or other Person having charge of such Ship or Vessel, Answers to certain preliminary Questions therein set forth: And whereas it is deemed expedient, that in the Case of Ships coming from, or having touched at any Port or Place on the Continent of America, or the Islands adjacent thereto, or coming from or having touched at any of the Ports in the West Indies, the following Questions, in addition to the said preliminary Questions, should be put to the Commander, Master, or other Person having the Charge of such Ships; viz.

- Q. How long after sailing from your Port of Lading, or having touched at any Port on the Continent of America, or the Islands adjacent thereto, or any of the Ports in the West Indies, was the first Appearance of Disease observed?
- Q. How had the Persons attacked been employed before they came on board?
- Q. Had they been employed in loading or unloading the Ship before she left the Port?
- Q. Had the Place which they inhabited before they sailed the Reputation of being healthy?

or was it subject particularly to the remittent Fever incident to the Country?

- Q. Had the Fever been frequent in the Place before the Ship sailed?
- Q. Did the Persons who were ill on board your Ship fall Sick nearly about the same Time, or within a few Days of each other; or did the Disorder spread successively from one to another, and increase considerably, or did it abate gradually, and cease to multiply as the Distance from the Ports you sailed from or touched at as aforesaid increased?
- Q. What was the greatest Number of Persons ill at the most sickly Period of your Voyage?
- Q. What were the whole Number of Persons on board your Ship when you sailed?
- Q. What is the whole Number of Persons now ill on board your Ship?
- Q. Can you state what were the Symptoms of Illness with which your Crew was first attacked, and what was the daily Succession and Change in them till their Death?
- Q. Whether any and what Medicines have been used, and what Methods have been adopted to prevent its spreading among the Crew?
- Q. Whether Attention has been paid to Cleanliness and Ventilation on board your Ship?

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased to order, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the Questions above set forth, in addition to the preliminary Questions directed by His Majesty's General Order in Council of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, respecting the Performance of Quarantine, be put to the Commanders, Masters, or other Persons having Charge of Ships or Vessels coming from or having touched at any Port or Place on the Continent of America, or the Islands adjacent thereto, or coming from or having touched at any of the Ports in the West Indies; and His Royal Highness is further pleased to order, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice aforesaid, That such Commanders, Masters, or other Persons having Charge of such Ships or Vessels, shall, upon such Questions being put by the Superintendent of

Quarantine, or his Assistant, or Principal Officer, or other Officer of the Customs, authorized by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, or any Four or more of them, to act in that Behalf, give a true Answer to the same in Writing or otherwise, and upon Oath, or not upon Oath, according as he shall be required by such Superintendent, or his Assistant or Principal Officer, or other Officer of the Customs authorized as aforesaid, under such Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by an Act passed in the Forty-fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making further Provision for the effectual Performance of Quarantine." And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General, and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *W. *Copy of a Letter from Admiral Sir Charles Cotton, Bart., Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, to John Wilson Croker, Esq; dated on board the San Josef, off Toulon, the 2d April 1811.*

SIR,

I HAVE much Satisfaction in transmitting to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty the accompanying Copy of a Letter from Captain Otway, reporting the Capture, by the Ajax and Unité, on the 31st Ultimo, of the Dromadaire French Frigate-built Ship, having on board Ammunition and Stores supped for Corfu.

The Dromadaire being a new Ship, and calculated for His Majesty's Service, I shall direct Commissioner Fraser to purchase her, together with the Stores, &c. &c. for His Majesty's Service.

SIR,

IN pursuance of the Instructions I had the Honour to receive from you on the 26th Instant, for intercepting the Frigates which had escaped from Toulon to the Eastward, I lost not a Moment in pushing through the Straits of Bonifacio, directing the Unité at the same Time to go round by Cape Corse. On my rejoining her last Night off this Island, I was informed she had been chased during the Day by the Enemy's Frigates, and that they were working through the Piombino Passage. All Sail was immediately made in that Direction, and at Dawn this Morning they were discovered (as per Margin\*) a little to Windward. From the short Distance they were from the Land, I regret we could only succeed in cutting off the Dromadaire, the Rear Ship; the other Two narrowly escaped from Captain Chamberlayne by running into Porto Ferrago.

The Dromadaire is a very fine Frigate-built Ship, of Eight Hundred Tons, sails remarkably well, and is only Five Months old; she was constructed by the French Government for the express Purpose of carrying Stores. Her Cargo consists of Fifteen Thousand Shot and Shells of different Sizes, and Ninety Tons of Gunpowder.

She was commanded by a Lieutenant de Vaiffeau, and her Complement One Hundred and Fifty Men. From the Report of the Prisoners it appears they were bound to Corfu.

*Copy of a Letter from Captain Atchison, Commander of His Majesty's Sloop the Scylla, addressed to Admiral Sir Robert Calder Bart., Commander in Chief at Plymouth, and transmitted by the latter to John Wilson Croker Esq.*

*His Majesty's Brig Scylla, within Les Triagos Rocks, off Morlaix, May 8, 1811.*

I HAVE the Pleasure to inform you, being close in with the Isle of Bas, this Morning at Half-Past Nine o'Clock observed a Man of War Brig, with Five small Sail under Convoy, to Leeward, which I immediately gave chase to; Half-Past Eleven came up and commenced firing at her and Convoy; Forty-five Minutes past Eleven, finding we were within Les Triagos and Pontgalo Rocks, and she was determined if possible to run on shore, obliged me to lay the Scylla on board her, then going Eight Knots; in Two Minutes afterwards we got possession, but not before her First Captain, One Midshipman, the Boatswain, and Three Seamen were killed, One Midshipman and Five Seamen dangerously, and Five Seamen slightly wounded. She proves to be the French National Brig La Cannoniere, of Ten Four-Pounders, one Twenty-four Pound Carronade, and Four Swivels, with a Complement of Seventy-seven Men, commanded by Monsieur Jean Joseph Benoit Schilds, Enseigne de Vaiffeau, out only Two Hours from Perros, bound to Brest. I think if we had been off the Land she would not have fired a Shot at us; but with the Hope of running her on shore, and being close to it, they fought hard, and I am sorry to say the Scylla had Two Seamen killed, One Midshipman and One Marine slightly wounded. I was only enabled to get possession of one of her Convoy, a Sloop laden with Wheat, the other Four having got within the Rocks and run on shore; indeed I was glad, from the shattered state of La Cannoniere, and the Wind and Sea increasing, to get out from where I was with what I had.

In this little Affair I have great Satisfaction to mention that Mr. Speck, First Lieutenant, all the Officers and Crew I have the Honour to command, did all they could; I should be proud to have an Opportunity where they could shew themselves to a greater Advantage.
