And that His Majesties Princely Care to have these Laws put in Execution against these Enemies of the Protestant Religion, may the more ciearly appear, He doth with Advice and Consent foresaid, Stature and Ordain that the Ministers of each Paroch, give up once in October Tearly, to their respective Ordinaries, true and compeat Lists of all Papiss and Subjustical winddrawers from the Publick Worship in their respetive Paroches, which Lifts are to be Subseribed by time Paroches, which Lifts are to be Subjerished by them; and that the Bishops give in a double of the said Lists subscribed by them, to the respective Sherists. Stewards, Bailiss of Royalty and Regality, and Mangistrates of Burroughs; to the effect the said Judges may proceed against them according to Law: As also the Sherists and other Magistrates foresaid, are berely Ordained to give an Account to the Majesties Pring Council in December Tearly, of their proceedings and other Panish and Formacal Senaratists. Cologne, Aug 31. This City is sending Deputies to the Emperor, to give His Imperial Majelly an account of their late proceedings against some of their Burgermallers, and to remove the ill Impresfions some persons have endeavoured to give his Imperial Majelly concerning the same. We cannot fee that the endeavours of the Imperial Minister, f r the composing the affairs of Liege, have as yet any faccels.

Francfort, Aug. 31. The Baggage of the French Ambassadors is arrived; and we expect now in few days to see all the Ministers here that are to assist at the Conferenc sthat are to be held here.

Francfort, Sept. z. From Ratisbonne we have an Account, that the Dyer has finished the Instructipas for their Deputies, that are to affift at the Conferences to be held here, and that having resolved to write a Letter to His Majetly of Great Brittain; the same had been Read in the Dyet and Approved of. On the 25th the Colledges of the Electors, and of the Princes, refumed the Debate concerning the raifing the 40000. Men, pur-fuant to their former Resolutions, and agreed on the Repartitions to be made in the ten Circles, by which they do ease the Circles of the Rhine, because of what they suffered in the late War; upon condition, that this present A-batement stall not be made a Precedent hereafter. This conclusion they have fint to the Emperor, and have prayed him by his Circular Letters to the several Circles, to hasten their Leavies. Elector of Suxony is fending an Ambaffador to the Emperor.

Hamburgh, Sept. 2. On Saturday 1aft Count Bere & the Empiror's Envoye parted from hince for Copenhagen, where he is to propose an Alliance between his Imperial Majelly and the King of Denmark, Our Letters from Hungary give great hopes of a happy conclusion of the Dyet; they telling us that the Emp ror was gone to Oedenburg, with a Refolution to give all imaginable fatisfaction to his Protestant Subjects. From Cottenburg they write, that some thousands of French Protestants are arrived there from France, with intention to fettle in that Kingdom. The Queen-Mother of Denmark is with her stwo Daughters the Electoress Palatine, and the Buctures of Saxony, at Zell, where they are most

splendidly entertained.

Bruffelt, Sept 9. The endeavours that have been hitherie aigh for the composing the Affairs of Liege, have not had any effect; nor does there apmar any disposition to an Accommassion; fince the late Hoffilities which have very much exasperated Mens Minds on both fides. We are expecting the Prince of Parma back from Antwerp; the Nations here have not confented to the Supply his

Highness demanded.
