Cologne, Aug 31. This City is fending Depaties to the Eniperor, to give His Imperial Majelly an account of their late proccedings againtt fonse of their Burgermalters, and to remove the ill Impre?fions fome perforis have endeavoured to give his Imperial Majefly concerning the fame. We cannot fee that the endeavours of the Imperial Minifter, $f r$ the compofing the affairs of Liege, have as yet 2.y faceelis.

Francfort, Aug. 31. The Baggage of the French Amballadors is arrived; and we expect now in few dayo to lee all the Minifters here that are to alift at the Conference sthat are to $b=$ held here.

Francfors, Sept. z. From Ratisbome we have an Accounc :that the Dyer has finithed the Inftructipods for their Depuries, that are to afift at the Conferences so be held here, and that baving refolved to write a Letter to His Majelly of Great Bfituin; the fame had b:en Read in the Dyet and Approved of. On the 25 th the Colledges of the Electors, and of the Princes, refumed the DeDate concerning the raifug the 40000 . Men, purfant to their former Refolutions, and agreed on the Reparticions to be made in the ten Cireles; by which they do eafe the Circles of the Abine, becaufe of what they fuffred in the date $W$ an ; apon cundition, that this prefent $A$. batement flathot te made a Precedent hereafter. This conclution they have font to the Emperor, and haye prayed him by his Cirtular Letters to the feveral Circles, to lailten thele Leavies. The EleEtor of Suxony is fending an Anbalfadar to the Emperor.

Humburgh, Sept. 2. On Saturday laft Count Barc ${ }^{4}$ the Emparor's Envoye parted from h.nce forcepenbaget, where hs isto propoic an Alliance berween his limpirial Majelty and phe King of Dinmark. Our Lette.s from Hurgary give great hopes of a happy canclufion of the Dyet; they relling us that the Emp ror was gone to Oedenburg, with a Refolution to give all inaginable fatisketrion to his Proreftant Subjects. Fram Cotitenburg they write, that fome thoufands of French Proteitants are arrived there fiom Fratce, with intention to fettle in that Kingdom. Tuc Quesn-Morher of Denmark is uith her itwo Daughters we Electorels Palatiae, and the Bloctuecivof Saxayy, at zell, whereahey are molt Sjulendjdily entertained.

Brufols, Srpt y. The endeavours that have been bitherto uied far the cernpofing the Absirs of siege, have put had any effect ; Bor does there apwar dity difiulition to an Accommertation; fince
the bate Holtilities which have very much exarperated Mens Minds on both lides. We are expecting the Prince of Pirma back from Lntwerp; the Nations here have not conlented to the supply his Highnefs demanded.

Paris. Sepf.9: The march of the Kings Troopsitbwards ftaly, is now the cortimon fuhjef of Pioples Dicourfes, though they do not jer ateree in their conjectures, concerning the Deign of it, This is certain, that the Princes of fraly are very muth alarmed ; and particularty the Republickof Gevotai; who, bs we are informed, has tedred the affittande of the Kirg of Spain, in care they are attacked; The King has given the sicur da Raefne, who at prefent Commands $2 \leq$ quadron of his Men of War in the Mediterrinean?
