**N**OTICE is hereby given to the Ladies and Gentlemen invited by the Command of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent to the Ball at Carlton-House, in Celebration of His Majesty's Birth-Day, that it is *unavoidably* postponed from Wednesday the 5th to Wednesday the 12th Instant.

**T**HE following Addresses have been presented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent; which Addresses His Royal Highness was pleased to receive very graciously:

To His Royal Highness George, Prince of Wales, REGENT of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

The humble Petition of His Majesty's Catholic Subjects, whose Names are hereunto subscribed, as well for themselves as others His Majesty's Subjects professing the Catholic Faith in Ireland,

*Sheweth,*

**T**HAT we your Petitioners, deeply regretting the Necessity which, in the jealously restricted Condition of Your Royal Highness's Regency, compels us to pray for an immediate Exercise of your Power, owe it nevertheless to our Character, our Loyalty, and our Honour, to entreat your Consideration of a direct and strong Attack recently made upon them all, and to solicit such Interference from Your Royal Highness on the Subject of our Complaint as the Circumstances of the Case shall appear to prescribe.

That your Petitioners have been forcibly interrupted in the constitutional Exercise of their chartered Right to petition the Two Houses of Parliament, and the public and humiliating Dispersion of their Body menaced and attempted.

That the Imbecility which retracted what Rashness had designed can in no degree palliate, much less excuse a studied, deliberate, and wanton Insult offered to Five Millions of His Majesty's loyal Subjects.

That our deep Attachment to the Constitution, and our ardent Desire of its full Participation, from every Motive which operates on Man, and eminently

for the Purpose of better securing to it a more zealous, a more general, and spirited Defence, will not suffer us to lie under the grievous Imputation of a wilful Breach of it.

That we therefore humbly pray Your Royal Highness will cause an Inquiry to be instituted into the Nature of the private Evidence on which the Issue of the circular Letter from the Irish Government, and its consequent Proceedings, have been alleged to have been grounded; and in the Event of so such Evidence appearing, (a Fact we strongly and confidently assume, and which the Openness of our Character, the Candour of our Nature, and the almost ostentatious Publicity of our Proceedings, justify us in doing, and thus indignantly and warmly repelling a Charge vitally aimed at our Loyalty and our Honour,) we further pray that Your Royal Highness will be graciously pleased to remove Charles Lennox Duke of Richmond, Lord Lieutenant and Governor General of Ireland, and the Right Honourable William Wellesley Pole, his Secretary, from your Councils.—And your Petitioners will ever pray. *Edward Hay, Secretary.*

To the PRINCE REGENT.

The dutiful Address of the Inhabitants of the Town and Suburbs of Paisley.

May it please Your Royal Highness,

WE, with most sincere Attachment to your Person and Interests, as will appear from the undisguised and upright Sentiments impressed upon our Hearts.

It is with the most lively Emotions of Sympathy we commiserate Your Royal Highness on the late melancholy Event which induced the Two Houses of Parliament to place in your Hands the Reins of Government.

At the same Time we observed, with marked Indignation, the Conduct of the Servants of the King Your Father, who annihilated in your Person, for a Time, some of the distinguished Prerogatives of the Regal Power, derogatory to your Character as a Man and injurious as a Prince—Restrictions which we consider as altogether unnecessary when we reflect on the much-admired filial Affection and other amiable Virtues of Your Royal Highness.

Thoroughly convinced that your Mind is actuated by every Principle which is truly noble, generous, and good, and that your superior Wisdom has preserved you free from the Fetters of any Party.

We presume to lay before Your Royal Highness Grievances which we hope, from your known Complaisance, will meet with that Attention which the Importance of the Subject demands.

The general Shock which public Credit has received throughout the Nation, and the numerous Bankruptcies which have taken place in consequence of that Shock, has produced in our Minds Sensations in the highest Degree alarming; that Confidence so essentially necessary in a commercial Country is entirely gone, and nothing but impending Ruin stares us in the Face. Almost every Description of Society is labouring under Privations unexampled in the Annals of our History; and Numbers who were formerly in very easy Circumstances are reduced to the sad Alternative of receiving Relief from the Benevolence of their more opulent Neighbours.

Under Circumstances so afflicting we observed, with the deepest Concern, that in a select Committee of the House of Commons, it was reported that the low State of Trade has arisen chiefly from wild Speculations entered into by our Merchants to South America; we also observed that the said Report mentions other Causes which led to this Depression, without explaining them.

We are of Opinion that no Evil can be remedied

without particular Attention being paid to the Origin of that Evil; and it appears evident to us that the accumulated, and still accumulating, Distress proceeds from the Exclusion of our Commerce from the Continent of Europe. We are fully aware that the shutting of the Continent against us was the Result of our Orders in Council and the blockading System, a Scheme highly impolitic and dreadfully prejudicial to the Interests of Commerce, and which affords irrefragable Proof of the blind Policy adopted by an imbecile Administration, whose public Conduct shew them utterly incompetent for managing the weighty Affairs of a great Empire.

It was this same System which shut the Continent of North America against us; and, if still persisted in, will in all Probability end in a Rupture with that Country, and render our Condition still more alarming.

We deeply lament the long Continuance of the War in which we are involved, carried on at a vast Expence of Blood and Treasure, and daily adding to our already enormous Taxation, Burthens too heavy for us to bear, without the smallest Prospect of attaining the End for which it was undertaken.

Although these corroding Evils prey deeply on the very Vitals of the Constitution, they are but the Effect of a System, which, if still persevered, will in the End destroy that venerable Edifice, once the Pride and Glory of Britons, reared by the Wisdom and sealed with the Blood of our Ancestors.

It is a System that has its Origin in Corruption, and consigns to Infamy all who come within the Sphere of its Attraction; its primary Object is Oppression and Injustice, alike hostile to the true Interests of the Crown, and subversive of the just Rights and Liberties of the Subjects.

It is the Source of Wars, unnecessary and unjust, destructive to the Happiness and fraught with Misery to the Human Race. Under the Influence of this baneful System, the established Laws of the Realm have been evaded. And, in a late Instance, when two of His Majesty's Cabinet Ministers were charged before the House of Commons with trafficking for Seats in Parliament, which was offered to be substantiated by Evidence at the Bar of their House, it was rejected by a Majority of its Members, because "the Frequency of the Practice was as notorious as the Sun at Noonday."

Men of great Talents, eminent Virtue, and superior Wisdom, may give a temporary Relief, but it is only by a Change of System that a permanent and radical Cure can be effected; and that Change can only be accomplished by granting to the People an adequate Share in the Representation of their Country, founded on the eternal Basis of Justice, fair, free, and equal.

As a preliminary Step to the Attainment of these desirable Objects, we would hail with Joy the Dismissal of those Men from your Councils who are unworthy of your Confidence, and the happy Selection of Men of Virtue and Talents, who might be the means of restoring the Blessings of Peace and Commerce to a brave, loyal, and affectionate People.

A DISPATCH of which the following is a Copy, was, on the 6th Instant, received at Lord Liverpool's Office, addressed to His Lordship by Lieutenant General Viscount Wellington, dated Elvas, 24th May 1811.

MY LORD,

SINCE I addressed you on the 22d Instant, I have received Reports that Marshal Soult had retired to Llerena; and the 3d and 7th Divisions having arrived at Campo Mayor, I have given Directions that Badajoz may be closely invested on the Right of the Guadiana To-morrow, and I propose forthwith to recommence the Operations of the Siege.

I learn from Castile, that Marshal Massena, Generals Junot, Loison, and others had set out for France, and that the Three Corps d'Armée, the 2d, 6th, and 8th, had been formed into Six Divisions, still called the Army of Portugal, having for its Commander in Chief Marshal Marmont, and General Regnier as Second in Command.

Marshal Sir William Beresford reports, that the greatest Number of the Officers and Men returned Missing, in the Action of the 16th Instant, have rejoined their Regiments.

*Extract of a Letter from Admiral Sir Charles Cotton, Bart., Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, to John Wilson Croker Esq; dated on board the San Josef, at Mahon, the 8th March 1811.*

YOU will receive herewith for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Copy of a Letter from Captain Eyre, the Senior Officer off Corfu, to Rear Admiral Boyles, dated the 10th Ultimo, giving an Account of the Capture, on the Evening of the 6th, of an Enemy's Convoy from Otranto, with Stores, Provisions, and Troops for the Garrison of Corfu, the latter upwards of Five Hundred in Number. Captain Eyre also mentions, in a Letter of the 13th of February, that Four more Vessels, one laden with Shot and the others Corn, had also fallen into his Hands, which make in the whole Thirty Sail, but he has not transmitted any List.

*His Majesty's Ship Magnificent, off Fano,*

SIR, February 10, 1811.

THE Enemy having long been without any favourable Opportunity of sending from the Italian Ports supplies to Corfu, availed himself of a strong Northerly Wind on the Evening of the 6th Instant, when Twenty-five Vessels sailed from Otranto, Twenty-two of which I have the Satisfaction to inform you were captured by this Squadron, one of them, a Vessel of One Hundred Tons, was loaded with Ordnance Stores, and another of the same Size with every Article of Sails, Cordage, and Ammunition proper for the Equipment of Twenty-five Gun Vessels.

The rest were loaded with Corn, and having also on board Three Hundred and Fifty Soldiers intended as a Reinforcement for the Garrison of Corfu.

I am happy to add to the List Four more Vessels with Corn, which were captured last Night.
