

could not foresee or prevent; and that if any Pensioner shall fraudulently attempt to receive a double Payment of the Pension, either at Chelsea or at different Places, he shall be struck off the Lists; for the better Prevention of which Frauds each Pensioner is required to produce his *Instruction Papers* at the Time of Payment.

Lastly, it is notified, that none will be entered upon the Pay Lists of the said Hospital, or be entitled to receive any Benefit therefrom, who shall not act agreeably to these Orders and Directions, particularly in sending their Half-Yearly Affidavits to the *Paymaster-General*, as above directed, and to no other Office; which several of the Pensioners have of late either neglected to do, or sent them irregularly to other Departments.

N. B. The under-mentioned Persons have been struck off the List, viz.

9th Dragoons, Mark M'Laughlan, at 9d. per Day, has been tried and found guilty of endeavouring to purchase Arms from a Soldier of the King's County Militia.

9th Foot, John Wallace, at 6d. per Day, for receiving the Pension of George Hargraves, of the 6th Foot; at 1s. 4½d. per Day.

4th Royal Veteran Battalion, Roger Toole, at 1s. per Day, for making Complaints against Two Officers of the 1st Garrison Battalion, which, upon a Court of Enquiry held to investigate the same, appeared to be unfounded.
