A DISPATCH, of which the following is an Extract, has been received from Lord Visconat Wellington, addreffed by His Lordship to the Earl of Liverpool, dated Quinta de St. Joso, June 27, 1811.

THE Enemy made a great Reconnoiffance with avery.brge Body of Cavalry upon Elvas and Campo Mayor on the 22d Inliant. The Cavalry of the Army of the South went upon Elvas from the Neighbourhood of Olivença, and the Woods between that Town and Badajoz; and the Ca-valry of the Army of Portugal upon Campo Mayor, from the Neighbourhood of Badajoz.

The former succeeded in cutting off a Picquet of the 11th Light Dragoons which had been polted on the Caya in Front of Elvas, under the Command of Captain Lutyens. It is underflood that the Caufe of this was that Captain Lutyens miftook a Regiment of the Enemy's Huffars for a Body of ours fent to his Support.

The 2d Huffars allo, which were on the Gua-diana, on the Right of Elvas, fuffered in their Retreat towards Elvas.

Ketreat towards Elvas. The Enemy were kept in check in the Neighbour-hood of Campo Mayor by the Honourable Major-General De Gray's Brigade of British and Briga-dier-General Madden's Brigade of Portuguese Ca-valry, and they retired without seeing the Position of our Troops. Since that Day they have made no Movement of Importance. Their Army is along 'the Guadiana between Badajoz and Merida, and their principal Occupation appears to be to prove their principal Occupation appears to be to procure · Subfiftence.

They are already beginning to experience, in fome degree, the Effects of drawing together, in Effremadura, their whole Force.
