WHEREAS the Time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council of the Eighth Day of February last, prohibiting, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eighth Day of August next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Royal Highness in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the said Eighth Day of August next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-

third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation on Order in Council." But it is nevertheless His Royal Highness's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking, or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High-Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, (except as hereinafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the

said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Royal Highness's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Grease, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majesty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles so exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the said Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the said Articles during the same Season; and provided also that the Exportation of the said Articles shall, in no Case, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the same Season: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *Chetwynd.*

Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Eighth Day of August next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. *Chetwynd.*

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for further continuing, until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, an Act, made in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships," it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign Ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irish Ships;" which, by an Act made in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, was revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth

Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six, and extended to Goat-Skins imported in Foreign Ships; and which was further continued by an Act made in the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight, should be, and the same was thereby further continued until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace: And whereas, by the said Acts, it is lawful for His Majesty, by His Order in Council, from Time to Time, when and as often as it may be judged expedient, to permit any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and also Goat-Skins, to be imported in any Foreign Ship or Vessel, and to be admitted to Entry in any Port or Place in the United Kingdom, on Payment of such and the like Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel, any Thing contained in any Act to the contrary notwithstanding: His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is thereupon pleased, in pursuance of the Powers vested in His Majesty by the said above recited Acts, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Eighth Day of August next, the Importation of Hides, or Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and also of Goat-Skins, dressed or undressed, in any Foreign Ship or Vessel, from any Port from which the British Flag is excluded; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel, from any Port from which the British Flag is excluded, with any of the Articles above mentioned, the said Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honourable House in the House of*

Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for making more effectual Provision for preventing the current Gold Coin of the Realm from being paid or accepted for a greater Value than the current Value of such Coin; for preventing any Note or Bill of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England from being received for any smaller Sum than the Sum therein specified; and for staying Proceedings upon any Distress by Tender of such Notes.

An Act to explain an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to permit the Interchange of the British and Irish Militias respectively."

The Speech of the Lords Commissioners to both Houses of Parliament, on Wednesday, July 24, 1811.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

HIS Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, has commanded us to signify to you the Satisfaction with which he finds himself enabled to relieve you from your Attendance in Parliament, after the long and laborious Duties of the Session. We are particularly directed to express His Approbation of the Wisdom and Firmness which you have manifested in enabling His Royal Highness to continue the Exertions of this Country in the Cause of our Allies, and to prosecute the War with increased Activity and Vigour.

Your determined Perseverance in a System of liberal Aid to the brave and loyal Nations of the Peninsula has progressively augmented their Means and Spirit of Resistance, while the humane Attention which you have paid to the Sufferings of the Inhabitants of Portugal, under the unexampled Cruelty of the Enemy, has confirmed the Alliance by new Ties of Affection, and cannot fail to inspire additional Zeal and Animation in the Maintenance of the common Cause.

His Royal Highness especially commands us to declare his cordial Concurrence in the Measures which you have adopted for improving the internal Security and Military Resources of the United Kingdom.

For these important Purposes you have wisely provided, by establishing a System for the annual Supply of the Regular Army, and for the Interchange of the Militias of Great Britain and Ireland; and His Royal Highness has the Satisfaction of informing you, that the voluntary Zeal which has already been manifested upon this Occasion has enabled Him to give immediate Operation to an Arrangement by which the Union and mutual Interests of

Great Britain and Ireland may be more effectually cemented and improved.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

His Royal Highness commands us to thank you in the Name and on behalf of His Majesty, for the liberal Supplies, which you have furnished for every Branch of the Public Service.

His Royal Highness has seen with Pleasure the Readiness with which you have applied the separate Means of Great Britain to the financial Relief of Ireland at the present Moment; and derives much Satisfaction from perceiving that you have been able to accomplish this Object with so little additional Burthen upon the Resources of this Part of the United Kingdom. The Manner in which you have taken into Consideration the Condition of the Irish Revenue has met with His Royal Highness's Approbation; and His Royal Highness commands us to add, that He looks with Confidence to the Advantage which may be derived from the Attention of Parliament having been given to this important Subject.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

His Royal Highness commands us to congratulate you upon the Reduction of the Island of Mauritius. This last and most important Colony of France has been obtained with inconsiderable Loss, and its Acquisition must materially contribute to the Security of the British Commerce and Possessions in that Quarter of the World.

The Successes which have crowned His Majesty's Arms during the present Campaign, under the distinguished Command of Lieutenant General Lord Viscount Wellington, are most important to the Interests and glorious to the Character of the Country. His Royal Highness warmly participates in all the Sentiments which have been excited by those Successes, and concurs in the just Applause which you have bestowed upon the Skill, Prudence, and Intrepidity so conspicuously displayed in obtaining them.

It affords the greatest Satisfaction to His Royal Highness to reflect that, should it please Divine Providence to restore His Majesty to the ardent Prayers and Wishes of His Royal Highness and of His Majesty's People, His Royal Highness will be enabled to lay before His Majesty, in the History of these great Achievements of the British Arms throughout a Series of systematic Operations, so satisfactory a Proof that the National Interests and the Glory of the British Name have been successfully maintained while His Royal Highness has conducted the Government of the United Kingdom.

Then a Commission for proroguing the Parliament was read. After which the Lord Chancellor said,

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

By Virtue of the Commission under the Great Seal, to us and other Lords directed, and now read, we do,

in Obedience to the Commands of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the Name and on Behalf of His Majesty, prorogue this Parliament to Thursday the Twenty-second Day of August next, to be then there holden; and this Parliament is accordingly prorogued to Thursday the Twenty-second Day of August next.

Downing-Street, July 27, 1811.

A DISPATCH, of which the following is an Extract, was on the 23d Instant received at the Earl of Liverpool's Office, addressed to His Lordship by Lieutenant-General Viscount Wellington, dated Quinta de St. Joao, July 11, 1811.

“THE Enemy continued in the Positions reported in my Dispatch of the 4th Instant, till the 7th, when they moved a large Body of Cavalry and about Two Battalions of Infantry from Montigo towards the Xevora, and from thence upon Villa de Rey, Le Roca, and Albuquerque.

The Object of this Movement was apparently to cut off our Detachments employed in observing the Enemy on that Side; in which, however, they did not succeed, Major Cocks having retired with all his Detachments upon St. Vicente, still keeping Communications open with Arronches and Portalegre.

The Enemy's Troops retired from Albuquerque on the 8th, and Major Cocks again entered that Town with his Parties on the same Day.

The Army of Portugal are again in the same Position on the Right of the Guadiana which they occupied when I addressed Your Lordship on the 4th Instant.

General Blake made an Attempt to obtain Possession of Niebla, on the Night of the 30th of June, in which Place the Enemy had a Garrison of about Three Hundred Infantry. I am sorry to say this Attempt failed, and he remained before the Place till the 2d Instant, and then retired towards the Guadiana. On the 6th Two Divisions of Infantry and the Cavalry of the 5th Army, under the Conde de Penne Vallamur, were crossing the Guadiana, on a Bridge constructed for them at St. Lucar by Colonel Austin.

The Artillery was embarked at Ayamonte, and General Ballasteros with the Advanced Guard remained upon the River St. Pedro.

It appeared to be General Blake's Intention to embark his Troops for Cadiz but neither General Castanos nor I have heard from him since he marched from Juramenha on the 18th of June.

In the North Marshal Bessieres had returned again to Valladolid from Benavente; and in the End of the Month of June the Enemy assembled at, and in the Neighbourhood of Valladolid a considerable Body of Troops. General Bonnet, however, still remained in the Neighbourhood of Leon and Benavente with the Troops under his Command; and I have received from General Silveira a Report of the Defeat of the French in an Attack made upon a Spanish Detachment from the Army in Galicia, in Front of Altorga, on the 25th Ultimo.

The Guerillas likewise continue their Operations, and besides the Alarm given to Valladolid on the 15th Ultimo, Don Julian gave a similar Alarm to Salamanca on the 29th Ultimo; but a considerable



Party of Guerillas belonging to different Chiefs, which had taken a Convoy at Penaranda, were afterwards surpris'd on the 30th of June, and dispersed, about Two Hundred having been killed, wounded, and made Prisoners."

SUPERIOR CLASS OF SHIPWRIGHT- APPRENTICES.

Navy-Office, July 8, 1811.

BY His Majesty's Order in Council, dated 20th September 1809, a Plan of Education was established at the Royal Naval College at His Majesty's Dock-Yard at Portsmouth for a Superior Class of Apprentices to Shipwrights, and Twelve Persons were admitted as Students on the 1st Day of January last;

And it being determined that Five more Students shall be admitted, the Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy hereby give Notice, that the Examination of Candidates will take place in His Majesty's Dock-Yard at Portsmouth, on the 6th November next, at Eight o'Clock in the Morning; and that such Persons as may be desirous of becoming Candidates for Admission, are required to send Notice of their Intention to the Navy Board, or the Commissioner of the aforesaid Yard, on or before the 1st Day of that Month.

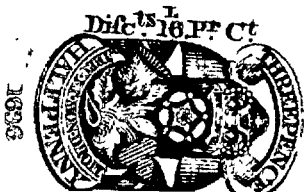
