THEREAS the Time limited by the Order of His Royal Highards the Prince Regent in Council of the Eighth Day of February last, prohibiting, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, the transporting into any Parts out of this Mingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eighth Day of August nexe: And whereas it is judged, expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingden that the faid Prohibition flould be contimed for some Time longer, His Royal High-Majetty, and by and with the Advice of His Majelly & Privy Council, dath, therefore, herchy order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Persons who soever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid Eighth Day of August next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Gloth or Canvas, on other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the The feitures inflicted by an Act palled, in the Thirty-

Said Articles to the Places for which they are ifo entered outwards, and for the Purpoles specified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commisfioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Royal Highness's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to'any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majesty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles so exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the faid Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the faid Articles during the fame Season; and provided also that the Exportation of the said Articles shall, in no Case, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Steeling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the Same Season: And the Right Honourable the Bords Committoners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admired of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respec-• • ; . tively appertain. Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that not Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Eighth Day of August next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf sirit obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An " Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the "Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majelly to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower " His Majelty to reltrain the carrying Goaltwife of " Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or " Ammunition:"-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Eritain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. ·Chetruynd.

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT :

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Fortyeighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for further continuing, until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of "Peace, an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of " His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation "into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in "Foreign Ships," it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His prefent Majesty, intituled " An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day " of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the " Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tak-" low, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign " Ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported " in British of Irish Ships;" which, by an Act made in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, was revived and further continued until the Twenty Sich

Day of Marely Ont thousand sight hundred and fix, and extended to Goat-Skins imported in Foreign Ships; and which was further continued by an Act made in the Forty-leventh Year of His present Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight, should be, and the same was thereby further continued until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace: And whereas, by the faid Acts, it is lawful for His Majesty, by His Order in Council, from Time to Time, when and as often as it may be judged expedient, to permit any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and also Goat-Skins, to be imported in any Foreign Ship or Vessel, and to be admitted to Entry in any Port or Place in the United Kingdom, on Payment of fuch and the like Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel, any Thing contained in any Act to the contrary notwithstanding : His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is thereupon pleased, in pursuance of the Powers velted in His Majesty by the said above recited Acts, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Eighth Day of August next, the Importation of Hides, or Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and also of Goat-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, in any Foreign Ship or Veilel, from any Port from which the British Flag is excluded; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Veffel, from any Port from which the British Flag is excluded, with any of the Articles above mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Veffel .- And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accord-Cherwynd. ingly.

The Speech of the Lords Commissioners to both Houses of of Parliament, on Wednesday, July 24, 1811.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

11S Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the Name and on the Bellast of His Majesty. has commanded us to fightfy to you the Satisfaction with which he finds himself enabled to relieve you from your Attendance in Parliament, after the long and laborious Duties of the Session. We are particularly directed to express His Approbation of the Wildom and Firmnels which you have manifelted in enabling His Royal Highness to continue the Exertions of this Country in the Cause of our Allies, and to profecute the War with increased Activity "rog of their and Vigour.

Your determined Perseverance in a System of liberal Aid to the brave and loyal Nations of the Peninsula has progressively augmented their Means and Spirit of Refistance, while the humane Artention which you have paid to the Sufferings of the Inhabitants of Portugal, under the unexampled Cruelty of the Enemy, has confirmed the Alliance by new Ties of Affection, and cannot fail to infpire additional Zeal and Animation in the Maintenance of the common Caufe. 1.00 (20.002.49)

His Royal Highness especially commands us to declare his cordial Concurrence in the Measures which you have adopted for improving the internal Security, and Military Resources of the United Kingdom. thro

For these important Purposes you have wifely provided, by establishing a System for the annual Supply of the Regular Army, and for bolic Hittarchange of the Militiat of Great Britain and idland; and His Royal Highnels has the Satisfaction of informing you, that the voluntary Zeal which has already been manifested upon this Occasion has enabled Him to give immediate Operation to an Arrange ment by which the Union and mutual Intercits of

Great Britain and Ireland may be more effectually cemented and improved.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

His Royal Highness commands us to thank you in the Name and on behalf of His Majesty, for the liberal Supplies, which you have furnished for every

Branch of the Public Service.

His Royal Highness has seen with Pleasure the Readiness with which you have applied the separate Means of Great Britain to the financial Relief of Ireland at the present Moment; and derives much Satisfaction from perceiving that you have been able to accomplish this Object with so little additional Burthen upon the Resources of this Part of the United Kingdom. The Manner in which you have taken into Consideration the Condition of the Irish Revenue has met with His Royal Highness's Approhation; and His Royal Highness commands us to add, that He looks with Considence to the Advantage which may be derived from the Attention of Parliament having been given to this important Subject.

My Lords, and Gentlemen, -.

His Royal Highness commands us to congratulate you upon the Reduction of the Island of Mauritius. This last and most important Colony of France has been obtained with inconsiderable Loss, and its Acquisition must materially contribute to the Security of the British Commerce and Possessions in that

Quarter of the World.

The Successes which have crowned His Majesty's Arms during the present Campaign, under the distinguished Command of Lieutenant General Lord Viscount Wellington, are most important to the Interests and glorious to the Character of the Country. His Royal Highness warmly participates in all the Sentiments which have been excited by those Successes, and concurs in the just Applause which you have bestowed upon the Skill, Prudence, and Intrepidity so conspicuously displayed in obtaining them.

It affords the greatest Satisfaction to His Royal Highness to restect that, should it please Divine Providence to restore His Majesty to the ardent Prayers and Wishes of His Royal Highness and of His Majesty's People, His Royal Highness will be enabled to lay before His Majesty, in the History of these great Achievements of the British Arms throughout a Series of systematic Operations, so satisfactory a Proof that the National Interests and the Glory of the British Name have been successfully maintained while His Royal Highness has conducted the Government of the United Kingdom.

Then a Commission for proroguing the Parliament was read. After which the Lord Chancellor said, My Lords, and Gentlemen,

By Virtue of the Commission under the Great Seal, to us and other Lords directed, and now read, we do,

in Obedience to the Commands of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the Name and on Behalf of His Majesty, prorogue this Parliament to Thursday the Twenty second Day of August next, to be then there holden; and this Parliament is accordingly prorogueatto Thursday the Twenty-second Day of August next.

Downing-Street, July 27, 1811.

A DISPATCH, of which the following is an Extract, was on the 23d Instant received at the Earl of Liverpool's Office, addressed to His Lordship by Lieutenant-General Viscount Wellington, dated Quinta de St. Joao, July 11, 1811.

THE Enemy continued in the Positions reported in my Dispatch of the 4th Instant, till the 7th, when they moved a large Body of Cavalry and about Two Battalions of Instantry from Montigo towards the Xevora, and from thence upon Villa de Rey, Le Roca, and Albuquerque.

The Object of this Movement was apparently to cut off our Detachments employed in observing the Enemy on that Side; in which, however, they did not succeed, Major Cocks having retired with all his Detachments upon St. Vicente, still keeping Communications open with Arronches and Portalegre.

The Enemy's Troops retired from Albuquerque on the 8th, and Major Cocks again entered that

Town with his Parties on the same Day.

The Army of Portugal are again in the fame Position on the Right of the Guadiana which they occupied when I addressed Your Lordship on the

4th Inftant.

General Blake made an Attempt to obtain Posfession of Niebla, on the Night of the 30th of June, in which Place the Enemy had a Garrison of about Three Hundred Infantry. I am furry to say this Attempt failed, and he remained before the Place till the 2d Instant, and then retired towards the Guadiana. On the 6th Two Divisions of instantry and the Cavalry of the 5th Army, under the Conde de Penne Vallamur, were crossing the Guadiana, on a Bridge constructed for them at St. Lucar by Colonel Austin.

The Artillery was embarked at Ayamonte, and General Ballatieros with the Advanced Guard re-

mained upon the River St. Piedro.

It appeared to be General Blake's Intention to embark his Troops for Cadiz but neither General Castanos nor I have heard from him since he marched from Juramenha on the 18th of June.

In the North Marshal Besseres had returned again to Valladolid from Benavente; and in the End of the Month of June the Enemy assembled at, and in the Neighbourhood of Valladolid a considerable Body of Troops. General Bonnet, however, still remained in the Neighbourhood of Leon and Benavente with the Troops under his Command; and I have received from General Silveira a Report of the Deseat of the French in an Attack made upon a Spanish Detachment from the Army in Gallicia, in Front of Attorga, on the 25th Ultimo.

The Guerillas likewise continue their Operations, and besides the Alarm given to Valladolid on the 15th Ultimo, Don Julian gave a similar Alarm to Salamanca on the 29th Ultimo, But a considerable
