W FEREAS the Tine Hinited by the Order of His Royal Higharts the Prince Regart in Council of the Eighth Day of February laft; prohibiting, in the Name and on the Behalf of His MajeRy, the transporting into any Parts out of this Mingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars. Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eighth Day of August next : And whereas it is judged, expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kington. that the faid Prohibition , flould be contransed for fome Time longer, His Royal High-Majefty, and by and with the Advice of His Majely 15 Brivy Council, dath, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Persons wholever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid Eighth Day of August next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, on other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiflion first being had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Farfejtures inflicted by an Act paffed, in the I hirty-

third Year and His Majefty's Reign, intituled " As " A& to will ble His Majefty to rekrain the Expor-": tation of elismi Stores, and more effectually to Sprevent theoHaportation of Salts Petre, Arms, and "Ammunition when prohibited by Proclamation ". on Orderan Ganadis" But it is nevertheles His Royal Highness's Planfure, that nothing herein gentwined fail graced, on he confirmed to extend, to any of His Majeky's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majely, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnahoe, or by the Committioners of His Majefty's Nary ; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Storm as may be neceffary for the Ule of fuch Ship or Velfel during the Courfe of her intended Woyage, sr, by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commillioners of the Admiralty for the Dime being; parsa the Exponsition of the laid for veral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majelly's Yanda dr Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Cokinics and Plantations in America or the West Indics, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefy's Forts and Settle-ments on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of-St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies : Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purpoles of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards and Garrilons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Illand of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Qath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, (except as hereinafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Commillioners of His Majesty's Cultoms, to carry the
