**THE** Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having given Directions for paying off the Principal of the above mentioned Exchequer Bills with the Interest due thereon, at the Exchequer Bill-Office, in the Receipt of Exchequer, New Palace-Yard, Westminster, on Monday the 26th Day of August 1811, Attendance will be given daily (Sundays and Holidays excepted) until, and including, Saturday the 10th Day of August 1811, from Ten o'Clock in the Morning till One in the Afternoon, for the Purpose of receiving the same. And for the greater Dispatch, the Bearers of the said Bills are desired to bring separate Lists of each Description of Bills containing the Numbers in Numerical Order, according to their respective Dates, with the Principal Sums and Interest due thereon, computed from, but excluding, the Days on which they are respectively dated, to the said 26th Day of August, inclusive, when the Interest will cease; and the said Bearers (being Holders or not) are indispensibly required to indorse each Bill with their usual Signatures, and to write their Names and Residence at the Bottom of each separate List; and they are moreover required to attend the Exchequer Bill Office for Payment, and to receive the New Bills, and give the Receipts for the same.
